### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 2 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 DISASTER PREPAREDNESS -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter: 6 7 "Commission" means the disaster preparedness commission. "Director" means the director of the office of disaster 8 9 preparedness. 10 "Disaster" means any natural or human-caused catastrophe, 11 the occurrence of which is unanticipated or difficult to 12 predict, that results in significant property damage, agricultural loss, hardship, suffering, psychological disorders, 13 14 medical difficulties, or loss of life within the state. 15 "Natural hazard" means a hurricane, storm, flood, tsunami, 16 tidal wave, wind-driven water, earthquake, volcanic activity, volcanic smog or vog, lava flow, rockslide, earthslide, fire, or 17 other natural disaster. 18

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- "Vog" means the substance created when sulfur dioxide and 1 2 other volcanic gases combine and interact chemically in the 3 atmosphere with oxygen, moisture, dust, and sunlight over a 4 period of time to form a visible haze consisting of gas and a 5 suspended mixture of tiny liquid and solid particles. -2 Office of disaster preparedness established. 6 is established in the department of defense, the office of 7 disaster preparedness. The director of the office shall be 8 9 appointed by the disaster preparedness commission and the 10 director's position shall be exempt from civil service. 11 director shall serve for a period of six years and thereafter 12 until a successor is appointed. The salary of the director shall be set at a rate no greater than \$ 13 a year and 14 shall not be diminished during the director's term of office 15 unless by general law applying to all salaried officers of the 16 If the director dies, resigns, becomes ineligible to 17 serve, or is removed or suspended from office, the first assistant to the director shall become the acting director until 18 19 a new director is appointed for a full term. 20 Duties of the director. (a) Notwithstanding

section 26-35, the director shall report exclusively to the

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- 2 comprehensive disaster preparedness plan for the State. The
- 3 disaster preparedness plan shall include:
- 4 (1) The identification of natural hazards;
- 5 (2) The designation of natural hazard impact zones;
- 6 (3) Priorities for natural hazard mitigation;
- 7 (4) Policies, requirements, and incentives to mitigate the
  8 problems caused by natural hazards, to be incorporated
  9 into rules such as county building codes, land use
  10 policies, and retrofitting incentives such as tax
- 11 credits; and
- 12 (5) Plans for best responses to disasters to minimize

  13 costs and protect the interests of state residents and

  14 visitors, their possessions, and pets, including plans

  15 ensuring the reliability of communication networks and

  16 power supplies for major state airports, health care

  17 facilities, disaster shelters, and other essential

  18 services.
- (b) The director shall report annually to the governor and
  the legislature no later than twenty days before the convening
  of each regular session of the legislature on the status of the

- 1 disaster preparedness plan and shall include any necessary 2 proposed legislation. -4 Disaster preparedness commission established; 3 There is established a 4 selection of advisory committees. (a) 5 disaster preparedness commission within the department of 6 defense for administrative purposes only. The commission shall 7 consist of eleven members as follows: 8 One member appointed by the governor; (1)9 (2) One member appointed by the speaker of the house of 10 representatives; 11 One member appointed by the president of the senate; (3)12 (4) Four members appointed by the mayors of the counties 13 of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the City and County of 14 Honolulu each of whom shall appoint one member; and Four members appointed by the mayors of the counties 15 (5) of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the City and County of 16 Honolulu each of whom shall appoint one member from 17 their respective county civil defense agency. 18 The commission shall: 19 Select one of its members to serve as chairperson; 20 (1)

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Appoint the director;

1	(3) Advise and assist the director in developing a								
2	comprehensive disaster preparedness plan for the								
3	State. The commission's duties in this regard shall								
4	include but not be limited to:								
5	(A) Gathering information about disasters that have								
6	occurred in the past; and								
7	(B) Establishing advisory committees to provide								
8	technical and other support to the director.								
9	(b) Any action taken by the commission shall be approved								
10	by a simple majority of its members. Six members shall								
11	constitute a quorum to do business.								
12	(c) The commission and the director, without regard to the								
13	requirements of chapter 76, may hire employees necessary to								
<b>L</b> 4	perform their duties.								
15	(d) No member of the commission shall receive any								
16	compensation for commission services; provided that members								
17	shall be allowed necessary expenses, including travel expenses,								
18	incurred in the performance of their official duties."								
19	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general								
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so								
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for								
22	the office of the director of disaster preparedness and the								

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- 1 disaster preparedness commission, including the hiring of
- 2 necessary staff.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 defense for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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### Report Title:

Disaster Preparedness Plan; Natural Disasters

### Description:

Establishes the Office of Disaster Preparedness and a Disaster Preparedness Commission to develop a disaster preparedness plan for Hawaii that includes the identification of hazards and hazard impact zones, disaster mitigation policies, requirements, incentives, and best responses.

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
