BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 28-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) The attorney general shall establish a statewide 4 witness program through which the attorney general may fund or 5 provide for the security and protection of a government witness 6 or a potential government witness in an official proceeding or 7 investigation where the attorney general determines that an 8 offense such as those described in sections 710-1071

9 (intimidating a witness), 710-1072 (tampering with a witness), 10 or 710-1072.2 (retaliating against a witness) is likely to be 11 committed or which involves great public interest. The attorney 12 general may also fund or provide for the security and protection 13 of the immediate family of, or a person otherwise closely associated with, such witness or potential witness if the family 14 15 or person may also be endangered. In determining whether such 16 security and protection or funds are to be provided, the 17 attorney general shall give greatest priority to official 18 proceedings or investigations involving pending or potential

organized crime, racketeering activity, promoting prostitution, 1 or career criminal prosecutions." 2 3 SECTION 2. Section 707-720, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (3) to read as follows: 5 "(3) In a prosecution for kidnapping, it is a defense which reduces the offense to a class B felony that the defendant 6 7 voluntarily released the victim, alive and not suffering from 8 serious or substantial bodily injury, in a safe place prior to 9 trial. This defense shall not apply to offenses charged under 10 paragraph (1)(g)." SECTION 3. Section 712-1202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows: 13 "(2) Promoting prostitution in the first degree is a class 14 [B] A felony." SECTION 4. Section 712-1203, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 16 amended to read as follows: 17 "§712-1203 Promoting prostitution in the second degree. A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in 18 (1)the second degree if the person knowingly advances or profits 19 from [prostitution by managing, supervising, controlling, or 20 owning, either alone or in association with others, a house of 21 22 prostitution or a prostitution business or enterprise involving]

5 SECTION 5. Section 712-1204, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:

7 "(2) Promoting prostitution in the third degree is a
8 [misdemeanor] class C felony."

9 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 11 begun before its effective date.

SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Description:

Gives priority, regarding witness security and protection, to proceedings and investigations involving the prosecution of promoting prostitution. Provides that kidnapping offenses shall not be reduced to class B felonies if the offense involves unlawfully obtaining the labor or services of the kidnapped person. Increases the felony classifications for promoting prostitution in the first, second, and third degree.
