A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 363-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 3 "(C) The director shall have the following principal functions, duties, and powers: 4 5 Serve as the principal official in state government (1)responsible for the performance, development, and 6 control of programs, policies, and activities under 7 8 this chapter; 9 (2) Oversee, supervise, and direct the performance by the director's subordinates of activities in such areas as 10 11 planning, evaluation, and coordination of veterans programs and development of a statewide service 12 13 delivery network; Assess the policies and practices of other agencies 14 (3) with respect to delivery of services and benefits to 15 16 veterans;

15		directives, or rules, except for the position of

20		necessary for the purposes of this chapter, including
21		a master contract with other state agencies receiving
22		federal and state funds for programs and services for

4		of a state veterans cemetery on Oahu; develop and

10	(10)	Act on behalf of deceased veterans found to be
