RELATING TO FISHING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 188-40.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended to read as follows:

11	fins landed from a vessel or found on board a vessel were taken,
12	held, or landed in violation of subsection (a) if the total
13	weight of shark fins landed or found on board exceeds five per
14	cent of the total weight of shark carcasses landed or found on
15	board.
16	(f) As used in this section:
17	"Land" or "landed" means when the shark or any part thereof
18	is [first] brought to shore[.] <u>in Hawaii.</u>
19	"Shark fin" means the raw or dried fin of a shark with the
20	shark carcass removed.



"Whole" means the entire shark with its head and flesh 1 2 intact, allowing for the removal of the blood, internal organs, 3 and tail at sea. 4 (q) All fines, fees, or costs collected pursuant to this 5 section shall be deposited to the credit of the state general 6 fund. Any property forfeited pursuant to this section shall 7 become property of the State." 8 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 10 begun, before its effective date. SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 14 INTRODUCED BY: Mele Canale

Report Title: Fishing; Sharks; Finning

Description:

Amends existing law prohibiting "shark finning" by making it a misdemeanor offense to harvest, land, or possess shark fins unless the fins were taken from a shark landed whole in the State. Imposes mandatory fines upon conviction in addition to existing civil sanctions. Establishes presumption regarding possession of shark fins not attached to the carcass.
