BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	"S6E- Plan approval or acceptance. (a) The approval or
5	acceptance of any archaeological inventory survey, mitigation
6	plan, preservation plan, interpretive plan, or other plan or
7	study by the state historic preservation officer shall be of no
8	further force or effect with the passage of ten years from the
9	date of the original approval or acceptance.
10	(b) If any action requiring the approval or acceptance of
11	the original inventory survey, mitigation plan, preservation
12	plan, interpretive plan, or other plan or study is required ten
13	years following the approval or acceptance of the original plan
14	or study, the state historic preservation officer shall require
15	that a new plan or study be prepared or that the original plan
16	or study be updated for the approval and acceptance of the state
17	historic preservation officer.
