### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 604-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§604-3 Disqualification, absence, vacancy. Whenever it is advisable, by reason of a vacancy in the office of district 4 judge of any circuit, or by reason of the disqualification of 5 6 any district judge, or the district judge's inability to attend 7 to the district judge's duties by reason of illness or temporary absence, or for any other reason, the chief justice of the 8 9 supreme court may designate the district judge of any other 10 circuit, [or] any district family judge of any circuit, or any 11 circuit judge of any circuit, to hear and determine any and all 12 matters then or thereafter pending in the district court to which the district judge [or], district family judge, or circuit 13 14 judge is called for such purpose, and while so engaged, the 15 district judge [or], district family judge, or circuit judge 16 shall have and exercise all of the powers of a regularly 17 appointed judge of the circuit to which the district judge  $[\Theta x]$ , district family judge, or circuit judge is called." 18 LRB 10-0629.doc
