### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to add a trustee to 1 2 the board of trustees of the employer-union health benefits 3 trust fund to represent the interests of the counties. According to the State of Hawaii 2008 Data Book there were 4 5 74,300 state workers and 18,550 county workers. For fiscal year 2007-2008, the total amount contributed to the employer-union 6 health benefits trust fund for health benefit plans was 7 8 \$551,754,581; of this amount \$307,468,074 came from the State, 9 \$128,636,434 came from the counties and county water supply 10 agencies, and \$115,650,073 was contributed by employees. Of the 11 total employer-union health benefits trust fund board 12 membership, there are five employer trustees on the board who 13 are currently state administration employees, and current law 14 does not include a provision for county representation. As employers, the counties pay a substantial amount into the 15 employer-union health benefits trust fund and should have some 16 say on the board of trustees. Recently, decisions have been 17



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1 made that affect the counties, including the decision to change 2 the prescription drug program, and have caught members by 3 surprise. Adding a trustee to the employer-union health benefits trust fund to represent the counties will ensure 4 5 members are better informed of changes to the programs and decisions are made that will take county interests into 6 7 consideration. 8 SECTION 2. Section 87A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended to read as follows: 10 §87A-5 Composition of board. The board of trustees of the employer-union health benefits trust fund shall consist of [ten] 11 12 eleven trustees appointed by the governor in accordance with the following procedure: 13 14 (1) Five trustees, one of whom shall represent retirees, 15 to represent employee-beneficiaries and to be selected 16 as follows: 17 (A) Three trustees shall be appointed from a list of two nominees per trustee selected by each of the 18 19 three exclusive representative organizations that 20 have the largest number of employee-21 beneficiaries;
