A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Sections 6 and 7 of Act 100, Session Laws of SECTION 1. Hawaii 1999, as amended by Act 154, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, 2 3 are repealed. 4 ["SECTION-6. The legislature finds that our state departments and agencies should constantly be working towards 5 6 improving the effectiveness and efficiency of our government. 7 Improving government operations through strategic planning can 8 result in increased and more effective government programs and 9 improved coordination among different agencies and levels of 10 government, and optimal use of state funds and personnel. 11 The legislature believes that the development of goals and 12 objectives is essential for state departments and agencies to 13 determine priorities, quide their decisions, and measure the 14 effectiveness of their programs and services. Moreover, goals 15 and objectives would assist the legislature in evaluating the 16 budgetary needs of departments and agencies. 17 The legislature further finds that many of our State's 18 departments and agencies have not formally established goals and

1	objectives. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require	
2	all departments and agencies, except for the judiciary, to	
3	identify their goals, objectives, and policies, to provide a	
4	basis for	determining priorities and allocating limited public
5	funds and human resources.	
6	SECTION 7. Except for the judiciary, every department and	
7	agency of the State shall develop and submit to the legislature	
8	no later	than twenty days prior to the start of the regular
9	session o	f 2000 and each regular session thereafter, an annual
10	report addressing the following:	
11	(1)	A statement of goals, including what the department of
12		agency hopes to accomplish over both the short and
13		long term;
14	(2)	Objectives and policies, specifically setting forth
15		how each goal can and will be accomplished;
16	(3)	An action plan with a timetable indicating how the
17		established objectives and policies will be
18		implemented in one, two, and five years; and
19	(4)	The process that the department or agency will use to
20		measure the performance of its programs and services
21		in meeting the stated goals, objectives, and
22		policies."]
