A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 "(b) With respect to the executive branch, except the 4 University of Hawaii [until June 30, 2011,] and the Hawaii 5 tourism authority, and the department of education until 6 June 30, 2011, the comptroller shall have complete supervision 7 of all accounts. The comptroller shall preaudit all proposed 8 payments of \$10,000 or more to determine the propriety of 9 expenditures and compliance with executive orders and rules that 10 may be in effect. When necessary, the comptroller shall 11 withhold approval of any payment. Whenever approval is 12 withheld, the department or agency concerned shall be promptly 13 notified. With respect to the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii 14 tourism authority, and the department of education, the 15 comptroller shall issue warrants for the release of funds for 16 the operating costs of the university, the Hawaii tourism 17 authority, or the department of education, as applicable, in

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1 amounts and at times mutually agreed upon by the governor or 2 director of finance and the university, the Hawaii tourism 3 authority, or department of education, as applicable; 4 provided[+] that:

5 (1) The amounts released shall not exceed the allotment 6 ceilings for the respective funding sources of the 7 university's or the department of education's 8 appropriations established by the governor for an 9 allotment period pursuant to section 37-34, or in the 10 case of the Hawaii tourism authority, revenues 11 received by the convention center enterprise special 12 fund and the tourism special fund pursuant to section 13 237D-6.5; and

14 (2) The comptroller may issue warrants as an advance from 15 the state treasury to the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of 16 education to establish a checking account and provide 17 working capital in amounts and at times mutually 18 19 agreed upon by the governor or director of finance and 20 the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism 21 authority, and the department of education.



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1 The University of Hawaii shall preaudit all proposed payments of 2 \$10,000 or more and the Hawaii tourism authority and the 3 department of education shall preaudit all proposed payments to 4 determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with 5 applicable laws, executive orders, and rules as may be in 6 effect. The University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority, 7 and the department of education shall make disbursements for 8 operating expenses from the amounts released by the comptroller 9 and maintain records and documents necessary to support those 10 disbursements at times mutually agreed upon by the university 11 president, the executive director of the Hawaii tourism 12 authority, or the superintendent of education, as applicable, and the comptroller; provided that when requested by the 13 14 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 15 education, the comptroller shall make all disbursements for the 16 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 17 education, as applicable, subject to available allotment. Funds 18 released pursuant to this section shall be deposited by the 19 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of 20 education, as applicable, in accordance with the provisions 21 applicable to the director of finance by chapter 38. Except for 22 moneys deposited by the Hawaii tourism authority in the



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1 convention center enterprise special fund pursuant to section
2 201B-8, and in the tourism special fund pursuant to section
3 201B-11, any interest earned on the deposit of funds released
4 pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the state
5 treasury at the end of each fiscal year."

6 SECTION 2. Section 40-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 "§40-2 Accounting systems and internal control; enforcing 9 the use of and inspection of the same. The accounting system 10 installed by the commission on public accountancy under Act 181, 11 Session Laws of Hawaii 1923, as amended by Act 220, Session Laws 12 of Hawaii 1925, for use in the offices of the comptroller, 13 director of finance, departmental and agency services of the State, and the auditors, treasurers, departmental and agency 14 15 services of the several counties shall be the accounting and reporting systems of the State and counties; provided that the 16 17 University of Hawaii [, until June 30, 2011,] may install a 18 different accounting system which shall be in conformity with 19 generally accepted accounting principles as applied to colleges 20 and universities; and provided further that the department of 21 education, until June 30, 2011, may install a different 22 accounting system which shall be in conformity to generally



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accepted accounting principles. The comptroller shall make such
 changes and modifications in the accounting system as shall from
 time to time appear to be in the best interest of the State and
 counties.

5 The departments and agencies of the executive branch are 6 respectively charged with the responsibility to maintain an adequate system of internal control and with the further 7 8 responsibility to see that the internal control system continues 9 to function effectively as designed. The comptroller shall make 10 such investigations and audits from time to time to enforce the use of the accounting system and internal control systems in the 11 executive branch. 12

13 The judiciary, the legislature, and each county shall be 14 responsible for the establishment and maintenance of its 15 respective internal control system."

16 SECTION 3. Section 40-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows:

18 "§40-4 Publication of statements. The comptroller shall 19 prepare and submit to the governor, immediately following the 20 close of each fiscal year, a statement of income and expenditure 21 by funds, showing the principal sources of revenue, the function 22 or purpose for which expenditures were made, together with a



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1 consolidated statement showing similar information for all 2 funds; also a statement showing the balance in each fund at the 3 beginning of the fiscal year, plus the receipts, minus the 4 disbursements, and the balance on hand at the close of the 5 fiscal year after deducting outstanding warrants and vouchers. 6 The comptroller may request all agencies, the judiciary, the 7 University of Hawaii [until June 30, 2011], the Hawaii tourism 8 authority, the department of education until June 30, 2011, and 9 the legislature to provide such information as may be required 10 for the preparation of statements."

SECTION 4. Section 40-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

13 "§40-6 Approval of business and accounting forms. The 14 comptroller shall determine the forms required to adequately 15 supply accounting and statistical data for the state government. 16 The comptroller shall require heads of departments and 17 establishments of the state government to submit proposed new 18 forms or proposed changes in current business and accounting 19 forms for review and approval before ordering the same printed; 20 except that the University of Hawaii [until June 30, 2011,] and the Hawaii tourism authority, and the department of education 21 22 until June 30, 2011, shall be subject to this requirement only



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2 statewide use in the State's accounting system. All standard 3 state forms shall be classified, numbered, and standardized in 4 design, dimensions, color, and grade of paper and recorded in a 5 catalogue of accounting and statistical forms by the 6 comptroller." 7 SECTION 5. Section 40-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "§40-58 In favor of assignees. No assignment of moneys by 10 a person to whom the State is directly indebted shall be 11 effective unless the assignment is first approved by the 12 comptroller or, in the case of [the University of Hawaii and] 13 the department of education [-7] until June 30, 2011, and the 14 University of Hawaii, by their respective chief financial 15 officers. The comptroller or the chief financial officers of 16 the University of Hawaii and the department of education may 17 prescribe the form for an assignment, and may approve the 18 assignment within a reasonable time period if, in their 19 respective discretion, the rights or obligations of the State, 20 the University of Hawaii, or the department of education under 21 any contract or other undertaking or under any law, rule, or 22 order by a competent authority will not be prejudiced thereby.

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1 Upon approval of the assignment, the comptroller or the 2 respective chief financial officers of the University of Hawaii 3 and the department of education shall draw a warrant payable to 4 the assignee. Except as to contracts encumbered by the 5 comptroller, the University of Hawaii, or the department of 6 education, each expending agency, upon notification of the 7 comptroller's approval of an assignment, shall prepare a claim 8 for payment in accordance with the terms of the assignment." 9 SECTION 6. Section 40-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows:

11 "§40-81 Report by agencies receiving special moneys. All 12 state officers, departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, or 13 agencies collecting or receiving any moneys not required by law 14 to be deposited in the state treasury shall report to the 15 comptroller all receipts and disbursements on account thereof 16 for each quarterly period of the calendar year not later than 17 the fifteenth day following the end of each quarterly period on 18 such forms and under such rules as may be prescribed by the 19 comptroller; provided that [until June 30, 2011,] with respect 20 to all moneys held outside the state treasury by the University 21 of Hawaii or until June 30, 2011, by the department of education 22 pursuant to the authority granted to the university and the



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1 department of education by this chapter, the University of
2 Hawaii and the department of education shall report to the
3 comptroller all transactions for each quarterly period not later
4 than the fifteenth day following the end of each quarterly
5 period on such forms and under such rules as may be prescribed
6 by the comptroller."

7 SECTION 7. Act 58, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended 8 by section 50 of Act 22, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, as amended 9 by section 1 of Act 306, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, as amended 10 by section 12 of Act 5, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, is 11 amended by amending section 14 to read as follows:

12 ""SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect upon its 13 approval; provided that:

14 [(1) The amendments made to sections 40-1, 40-4, and 40-6, 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes, by part I of this Act shall 16 not be repealed when those sections are reenacted on 17 June 30, 2006, by section 1 of Act 137, Session Laws 18 of Hawaii 2005;

19 (2)] (1) Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Part I shall be 20 repealed on June 30, 2010, and:

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INTRODUCED BY:

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Report Title: University of Hawaii; Fiscal Autonomy

Description:

Gives the University of Hawaii fiscal autonomy from the comptroller beyond June 30, 2011. Removes the time limit on the authority of the University of Hawaii to install a different accounting system. Extends the comptroller's authority to request the University of Hawaii to provide information for the preparation of income and expenditure statements. Extends the University of Hawaii's authority to submit proposed new forms or changes to forms for only uniform business and accounting forms for review and approval. Extends the University of Hawaii's chief financial officer's authority to approve assignment of moneys to assignees. Extends beyond June 30, 2011 the requirement for the University of Hawaii to report to the comptroller transactions involving moneys held outside of the state treasury by the University of Hawaii.
