A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 6E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"[+] $6E-5$] State historic preservation officer. (a)		
4 -	The [governor shall appoint a] state historic preservation		
5	officer[, and may appoint the officer] shall be appointed by the		
6	governor from a list of not less than three nominees submitted		
7	by the board of land and natural resources and may be appointed		
8	without regard to chapter 76[, who]. In developing the list of		
9	nominees, the board shall consult with appropriate Hawaii and		
10	historic preservation organizations.		
11	(b) Nominees for state historic preservation officer shall		
12	have specialized experience and knowledge, skills, and		
13	demonstrated ability in archaeology, history, cultural resources		
14	management, planning, environmental studies, historic		
15	preservation, or a closely related field.		
16	(c) Desirable qualifications for nominees for state		
17	historic preservation officer include the following:		



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1	(1)	Working knowledge of the National Historic	
2		Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and other	
3		federal laws, regulations, and executive orders that	
4		govern historic preservation matters;	
5	(2)	Broad knowledge of the national and state historic	
6		preservation program and the roles of the federal,	
7		state, and local governments, private organizations,	
8		and the public;	
9	<u>(3)</u>	Knowledge of various federal agency policies,	
10		procedures, and regulations, and programs, and	
11		experience in resolving conflicts between historic	
12		preservation requirements and other agency needs;	
13	(4)	Knowledge of the cultural history, practices, and	
14		values of native Hawaiians; and	
15	(5)	Experience working with Hawaiian civic or cultural	
16		organizations.	
17	<u>(d)</u>	The state historic preservation officer shall be	
18	responsibl	le for the comprehensive historic preservation program	
19	and [who]	shall be the state liaison officer for the conduct of	
20	relations	with the federal government and the respective states	
21	with regard to matters of historic preservation. The state		
22	historic <u>p</u>	preservation officer shall be [appointed on the basis	
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of professional competence and experience in the field of
historic preservation and shall be] placed in the department for
the purposes of the state program."
SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title: State Historic Preservation Officer

Description:

Amends law to require that the state historic preservation officer be appointed from a list of at least 3 nominees submitted by the board of land and natural resources. Requires that the list of nominees be developed in consultation with the appropriate Hawaii and historic preservation organizations. Establishes qualifications of the officer.

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
