A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GASOLINE DEALERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many retail gasoline 2 stations in the State charge their customers for access to 3 The legislature finds that water is essential to the water. 4 safe operation of motor vehicles on the roads of the State. In 5 addition, with gasoline prices rising, it is imperative that 6 motorists keep their automobiles running at optimum condition to maximize fuel efficiency. Adequate water levels keep automobile 7 8 engines cool and contribute to obtaining the optimum miles per 9 gallon. The legislature further finds that access to potable 10 water will allow persons to promote good hygiene by washing 11 their hands after handling dirty gas pumps or coming into 12 contact with gasoline and other automotive fluids. This may 13 help prevent the spread of diseases, such as H1N1 influenza, and 14 promote the safe operation of motor vehicles. Additionally, the 15 legislature finds that California has recognized the importance 16 of this issue, and its legislature recently passed legislation 17 requiring retail gas stations to provide free air and water to 18 motorists for these purposes.

8	station, during operating hours, shall provide and make
9	available at no cost to customers who purchase motor vehicle
10	fuel, potable water for use in servicing the vehicle for which
11	the motor vehicle fuel was purchased or for washing their hands
12	after dispensing fuel. Servicing the vehicle does not include
13	washing the vehicle.
14	(b) Violations of this section shall be subject to a civil
15	fine of not more than \$1,000 per day of violation."
16	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on September 1,
