H.B. NO. 2205

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many professions 2 licensed in the state, including physicians, optometrists, and 3 real estate salespersons, require the completion of continuing 4 education courses as a pre-requisite to license renewal. 5 Consequently, the legislature recognizes that in order to 6 maintain the highest level of competency of nurses practicing in 7 the state, it is necessary to include a continuing education 8 component to nurse licensure requirements as well.

9 SECTION 2. Section 457-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

"§457-9 Renewal of license; denial, suspension, or 11 12 revocation of license for default of student loan, student loan 13 repayment contract, or scholarship contract; inactivation and 14 reactivation of license; restoration of forfeited license. (a) 15 The license of every person licensed, recognized, or granted 16 prescriptive authority shall expire on June 30 of every odd-17 numbered year and shall be renewed biennially, except as 18 provided in this section. Biennially in each odd-numbered year, HB HMS 2010-1233

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the board shall make available an application for renewal of 1 2 license before the deadline set forth by the board to every 3 person to whom a license was issued or renewed during the The applicant shall complete the application and 4 biennium. submit it to the board with a renewal fee and all required 5 6 documents on or before the deadline set by the board. The applicant shall provide documents from proper agencies or 7 parties of any criminal conviction or any disciplinary action 8 9 taken or pending in this State or any other state in the United 10 States or any territory or possession under the jurisdiction of 11 the United States within the two years prior to application for 12 renewal of license. Upon receipt of the application and fee, 13 the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue 14 to the applicant a certificate of renewal for the biennium 15 expiring two years hence on the deadline set by the board. The 16 renewal shall render the holder thereof a legal practitioner of 17 nursing for the period stated on the renewal form.

(b) The applicant shall also provide the board with proof
of having attended fifteen hours of continuing education, or its
equivalent as determined by the board, during the two-year
period prior to the application for renewal. Failure to satisfy
the continuing education requirement by the license expiration

The board shall have the 2 authority to grant an extension for the continuing education 3 4 requirement upon a showing of good cause. 5 [(b)] (c) Any licensee who fails to renew a license as provided in subsection (a) and (b) but continues to practice 6 7 shall be considered an illegal practitioner and shall be subject 8 to the penalties provided for violations of this chapter. The 9 failure to timely renew a license, the failure to pay all 10 applicable fees, the dishonoring of any check upon first 11 deposit, or the failure to comply with any other requirement 12 provided by law shall cause the license to be automatically 13 forfeited; provided that the person's license may be restored by 14 the board within two years after the date of forfeiture upon 15 compliance with the licensing renewal fees, penalty fees, and

date shall result in the renewed license being automatically

16 compliance resolution fund fees.

A nurse who does not intend to practice nursing in the State and elects to be placed on inactive status shall so indicate in writing during the license renewal period or by so indicating on the license renewal application, and paying inactivation and all appropriate fees. Should the nurse wish to resume nursing at some future time, the nurse shall notify the

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1 board in writing and remit the reactivation and renewal fees and 2 application form as provided in subsection (a). A nurse who has 3 not actively practiced in this State or any other state in the 4 United States or any territory or possession under the 5 jurisdiction of the United States for more than five years may be required by the board to submit proof of continued competency 6 7 by retaking and passing the licensing examination or 8 successfully completing appropriate continuing education 9 recognized by the board.

10 [(c)] (d) Notwithstanding any provision in this chapter to 11 the contrary, the board shall not renew or reinstate, or shall 12 deny, suspend, or revoke, any license or application if the board has received certification from an administering entity 13 14 pursuant to chapter 436C that the licensee or applicant is in 15 default or breach of any obligation under any student loan, 16 student loan repayment contract, or scholarship contract that financed the licensee's or applicant's education, or has failed 17 18 to comply with a repayment plan.

19 The board, in receipt of a certification pursuant to 20 chapter 436C, as applicable, and without further review or 21 hearing, shall:

22 (1) Suspend the license;

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(2) Deny the application or request for renewal of the license; or

3 (3) Deny the request for reinstatement of the license,
4 and unless otherwise provided by law, shall renew, reinstate, or
5 grant the license only upon receipt of an authorization from the
6 administering entity."

7 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the continuing education requirement in section 457-9(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any 8 9 licensee under section 457-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, whose 10 license must be renewed on or before June 30, 2011, shall have 11 until December 31, 2011, to comply with the continuing education 12 requirements of section 457-9(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes; 13 provided that the state board of nursing may grant an extension upon a showing of good cause. The licensee's license shall 14 15 remain valid during such time; provided that all other renewal 16 requirements have been satisfied.

SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
