A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that obtaining permits,
licenses, and other approvals from state departments and
agencies is often a long and time consuming process, especially
for small businesses and not-for-profit groups that do not have
the financial and personnel resources to shepherd permit and
license applications through multiple and often duplicative
processes.

8 The purpose of this Act is to create a "permit czar" in 9 each of the departments of agriculture and land and natural 10 resources to consolidate and facilitate the permit processing 11 procedures in these two departments.

SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

16 established within the department of agriculture a permitting

10	SECTION 3. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

14	established within the department a permitting coordinator to be		
15	appointed by the governor pursuant to section 26-34.		
16	(b) All permits, licenses, and approvals whose issuance or		
17	denial comes within the purview of the department, shall be		
18	reviewed, processed, and granted or denied by the permitting		
19	coordinator. The permitting coordinator shall:		
20	(1) Identify all agencies within the department with		
21	permit processing or approval responsibilities;

20	SECTION 4. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of					
21	the department of agriculture and the department of land and					
22	natural r	esour	ces relating to licensing and permitting are			
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transferred to the permitting coordinators of the respective
 departments.

3 All appropriations, records, equipment, SECTION 5. 4 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, 5 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, 6 acquired, or held by the department of agriculture and the 7 department of land and natural resources relating to the functions transferred to the permitting coordinators of the 8 9 respective departments shall be transferred with the functions 10 to which they relate.

SECTION 6. All rules, policies, procedures, quidelines, 11 and other material adopted or developed by the department of 12 agriculture and the department of land and natural resources to 13 implement provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes which are 14 15 reenacted or made applicable to the permitting coordinator of 16 the respective department by this Act, shall remain in full 17 force and effect until amended or repealed by the permitting 18 coordinator pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. In the interim, every reference to the agency or unit of the 19 20 department or the head of the agency or unit in those rules, 21 policies, procedures, guidelines, and other material is amended 22 to refer to the permitting coordinator as appropriate.
