### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOBILE COMMUNICATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§291C- Mobile electronic devices; prohibitions. (a)</u>
5	No person shall operate a motor vehicle while using a mobile
6	electronic device.
7	(b) The use of a mobile electronic device for the sole
8	ourpose of making a "911" emergency communication shall be an
9	affirmative defense to this section.
10	(c) The following persons shall be exempt from the
11	provisions of subsection (a):
12	(1) Emergency responders using a mobile electronic devic
13	while in the performance and scope of their official
14	duties;
15	(2) Drivers using two-way radios while in the performanc
16	and scope of their work-related duties; and

1	(3) Drivers holding a valid amateur radio operator license
2	issued by the Federal Communications Commission and
3	using a half-duplex two-way radio.
4	(d) As used in this section:
5	"Emergency responders" means any firefighters, emergency
6	medical technicians, mobile intensive care technicians, civil
7	defense workers, police officers and federal and state law
8	enforcement officers.
9	"Mobile electronic device" means any handheld or other
10	portable electronic equipment capable of providing:
11	(1) Wireless data communication between two or more
12	persons; or
13	(2) Amusement, including but not limited to a cellular
14	phone, text messaging device, paging device, personal
15	digital assistant, laptop computer, video game, or
16	digital photographic device;
17	provided that "mobile electronic device" does not include any
18	audio equipment or any equipment installed in a motor vehicle
19	for the purpose of providing navigation, emergency assistance to
20	the operator of the motor vehicle, or video entertainment to the
21	passengers in the rear seats of the motor vehicle.
