A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOBILE COMMUNICATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§291C- Mobile electronic devices; prohibitions. (a)		
5	No person shall operate a motor vehicle while using a mobile		
6	electronic device.		
7	(b) The use of a mobile electronic device for the sole		
8	purpose of making a "911" emergency communication shall be an		
9	affirmative defense to this section.		
10	(c) The following persons shall be exempt from the		
11	provisions of subsection (a):		
12	(1) Emergency responders using a mobile electronic device		
13	while in the performance and scope of their official		
14	duties;		
15	(2) Drivers using two-way radios while in the performance		
16	and scope of their work-related duties and who are		
17	operating fleet vehicles or who possess a commercial		
18	vehicle license; and		

T	(3)	Drivers holding a valid amateur radio operator license
2		issued by the Federal Communications Commission and
3		using a half-duplex two-way radio.
4	(d)	Every person who violates this section shall be
5	subject t	o the following:
6	(1)	For a first infraction, or any infraction not preceded
7		within one year by a prior violation of this section,
8	•	a fine of at least \$100 but less than \$200;
9	(2)	For an infraction that occurs within one year of a
10	-	prior violation of this section, a fine of at least
11	÷	\$200 but less than \$300 and the suspension of the
12		person's driver's license and privilege to operate a
13		vehicle for a period of 30 days; and
14	(3)	For an infraction that occurs within two years of two
15	-	prior violations of this section, and for the fourth
16		and each additional violation of this section,
17		regardless of when the violation occurred, a fine of
18		at least \$300 but less than or equal to \$500 and the
19		suspension of the person's driver's license and
20	-	privilege to operate a vehicle for a period of 90
21		days.
22	(e)	As used in this section:

1	"Emergency responders" means any firefighters, emergency			
2	medical technicians, mobile intensive care technicians, civil			
3	defense workers, police officers, and federal and state law			
4	enforcement officers.			
5	"Mobile electronic device" means any handheld or other			
6	portable electronic equipment capable of providing:			
7	(1) Wireless audio, video, or data communication between			
8	two or more persons; or			
9	(2) Amusement, including a cellular phone, text messaging			
10	device, paging device, personal digital assistant,			
11	laptop computer, video game, or digital photographic			
12	<pre>device;</pre>			
13	provided that "mobile electronic device" does not include any			
14	audio equipment or any equipment installed in a motor vehicle			
15	for the purpose of providing navigation, emergency assistance to			
16	the operator of the motor vehicle, or video entertainment to the			
17	passengers in the rear seats of the motor vehicle.			
18	"Operate" means to drive or assume actual physical control			
19	of a vehicle upon a public way, street, road, or highway in the			
20	State.			
21	"Use or using" means holding a mobile electronic device			
22	while operating a motor vehicle."
