A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE USE OF MOBILE PHONES WHILE DRIVING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that over the span of a
decade, the cellular phone has gone from novelty to convenience
to a fixture of modern life. It is difficult to travel the
state and not meet someone who is using or carrying a cellular
phone. A great part of the allure of mobile phones,
particularly cellular phones, is the convenience of using a
phone nearly anywhere, including while driving.

8 The legislature also finds that driving with two hands on 9 the steering wheel and full attention to traffic and road 10 conditions increases driving safety. Mobile phone usage while 11 driving reduces driving safety due to the need to use at least 12 one hand to program the phone to make a call, receive a call, or 13 any number of things. The legislature further finds that as a 14 result of the safety hazard posed by mobile phone use when 15 driving, mobile phone manufacturers have started to produce devices that allow drivers to use their mobile phones without 16 17 the use of their hands. These "hands-free" devices have

obviated the present need to legislatively ban all use of mobile 1 2 phones while driving. The purpose of this Act is to allow mobile phone use while 3 operating a motor vehicle only when equipped with a hands-free 4 5 accessory. SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 8 and to read as follows: 9 "§291C- Mobile telephone use; prohibited. (a) No 10 driver shall use a mobile telephone while operating a moving 11 motor vehicle in the state unless the mobile telephone is 12 equipped with a hands-free accessory and the mobile telephone is 13 being used in the hands-free mode. 14 (b) No person shall use a mobile telephone, including 15 those with hands-free accessories, while operating a moving 16 school bus that is carrying passengers. 17 (c) No person shall use a mobile telephone, including 18 those with hands-free accessories, while operating a moving transit vehicle. 19 (d) It shall be an affirmative defense to an alleged 20 21 violation of this section, that the person was using a mobile 22 telephone:

3	(h) For the purposes of this section:		
4	"Commercial vehicle" means a vehicle registered to a		
5	business that has a gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand		
6	and one pounds or more.		
7	"Hands-free accessory" means an attachment, add-on, built-		
8	in feature, or addition to a mobile telephone, whether or not		
9	permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used, allows		
10	the driver to maintain both hands on the steering wheel.		
11	"Mobile telephone" means a cellular, analog, satellite,		
12	wireless, or digital telephone capable of sending or receiving		
13	telephone messages without an access line for service.		
14	"Transit vehicle" means every motor vehicle designed for		
15	carrying more than ten passengers, other than a school bus or		
16	taxicab, and used for the transportation of persons for		
17	compensation.		
18	"Use" means talking, typing text messages, placing or		
19	receiving a call, or attempting to place or receive a call, on a		
20	mobile telephone."
