8	chapter 572, as are granted to spouses in a marriage validly
9	entered into pursuant to chapter 572."
10	SECTION 2. Section 572-1.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	repealed.
12	[" [§572-1.6] Private solemnization not unlawful. Nothing
13	in this chapter shall be construed to render unlawful,or
14	otherwise affirmatively punishable at law, the solemnization of
15	same sex relationships by religious-organizations; provided that
16	nothing in this section shall be construed to confer any of the
17	benefits, burdens, or obligations of marriage under the laws of
18	Hawaii."]

SECTION 3. Section 572C-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
repealed.

3	[" [§572C-7] Termination of reciprocal beneficiary
4	relationship; filing fees and records; termination upon
5	marriage. (a) Either party-to-a reciprocal beneficiary
6	relationship may terminate the relationship by filing a signed
7	notarized declaration of termination of reciprocal beneficiary
8	relationship by either of the reciprocal beneficiaries with the
9	director. For the filing of the declaration, the director shall
10	collect a fee of \$8, which shall be remitted to the director of
11	finance for deposit into the general fund.
12	(b) Upon the payment of the fee, the director shall file
13	the declaration and issue a certificate of termination of
14	reciprocal beneficiary relationship to each party of the former
15	relationship. The director shall maintain a record of each
16	declaration and certificate of termination of reciprocal
17	beneficiary relationship filed with or issued by the director.
18	(c) Any marriage license subsequently issued by the
19	department to any individual registered as a reciprocal
20	beneficiary shall automatically terminate the individual's
21	existing reciprocal beneficiary relationship.

1 (d) If either party to a reciprocal beneficiary 2 relationship enters into a legal marriage, the parties shall no 3 longer have a reciprocal beneficiary relationship and shall no 4 longer be entitled to the rights and benefits of reciprocal 5 beneficiaries."] 6 SECTION 4. Except for part I of chapter 572, every reference in the Hawaii Revised Statutes to "marriage", or any 7 8 aspect thereof, shall apply equally to "reciprocal 9 beneficiaries", including: 10 Every reference in the Hawaii Revised Statutes to (1)11 "married" or "spousal" shall apply equally to the 12 status of partners certified as reciprocal 13 beneficiaries in Hawaii; 14 (2)Every reference to "husband", "wife", or "spouse" 15 shall apply equally to a partner in a certified 16 reciprocal beneficiary relationship; and Every reference to marital status, unless stated 17 (3) 18 otherwise under reciprocal beneficiaries, including 19 provisions pertaining to parties and procedures for 20 annulment, divorce, separation, or dissolution, shall 21 apply equally and as necessary to reciprocal

This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 4 5 begun before its effective date. 6 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2011. 8 SECTION 7. 9
