3 SECTION 15. (a) Between July 1, 2010 and September 30, 4 2010, the department of agriculture shall adopt new or amend 5 existing rules to impose or increase fees authorized to be 6 charged under section 141-4 and chapter 147, Hawaii Revised 7 Statutes, without regard to the public notice and public hearing 8 requirements of section 91-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the small 9 business impact review requirements of chapter 201M, Hawaii 10 Revised Statutes, or the limit on fee increases under section 11 92-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The department shall set the 12 fees at amounts intended to generate sufficient revenues to pay 13 the operation and maintenance costs of implementing the 14 agriculture inspection and certification programs of chapters 15 141 and 147, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and central services and departmental administrative expense assessments of section 36-27 16 and section 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 17

(b) If, by September 30, 2010, the department of
agriculture has not complied with subsection (a), then the fee
charged for each inspection or certification conducted under
authority of section 141-4 and chapter 147 shall be \$
commencing October 1, 2010.
