A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Protect Victims
 of Domestic Violence Act".

3 SECTION 2. Section 707-701, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:

5 "(1) A person commits the offense of murder in the first 6 degree if the person intentionally or knowingly causes the death 7 of:

8 (a) More than one person in the same or separate incident;
9 (b) A law enforcement officer, judge, or prosecutor
10 arising out of the performance of official duties;
11 (c) A person known by the defendant to be a witness in a
12 criminal prosecution and the killing is related to the
13 person's status as a witness;

14 (d) A person by a hired killer, in which event both the
15 person hired and the person responsible for hiring the
16 killer shall be punished under this section; [or]
17 (e) A person while the defendant was imprisoned [-];

12		For the purposes of this paragraph, "public servant"			
13		includes but is not limited to an educational worker.			
14		"Educational worker" has the same meaning as defined			
15		in section 707-711; [or]			
16	(d)	With the use of a dangerous instrument $[-]$; or			
17	<u>(e)</u>	By threatening:			
18		(i) A person whom the defendant has been restrained,			
19		by order of any court, including an ex parte			
20		order, from contacting, threatening, or			
21		physically abusing pursuant to chapter 586; or			



1	<u>(ii)</u>	A person who is being protected, pursuant to
2		section 709-906(4), by a police officer ordering

6	SECTION 6	. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
7	matured, penal	ties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
8	begun, before	its effective date.

11	SECTION 8	. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
