### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Housing first, also known as rapid re-housing, 1 2 is a recent innovation in human service programs regarding the treatment of the homeless. Housing first is an alternative to a 3 4 system of emergency shelters and transitional housing progressions. Rather than moving homeless individuals through 5 6 different levels of housing on the way to independent living, housing first moves homeless individuals immediately to their 7 8 own apartments. By creating a stable housing environment, other 9 issues can be addressed that impact the household including 10 employment, job training, and health care.

Homeless individuals, especially the chronically homeless, hose with disabilities that include addictions and mental illnesses, are extremely fragile. Chronically homeless individuals are the least likely of the homeless population to ever reach independent living.

16 The purpose of this Act is to establish a five-year housing 17 first pilot program to address the chronically homeless

18 population.

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SECTION 2. Chapter 184, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: "§184-4 Parks for homeless special fund. (a) There is 5 established in the state treasury the parks for homeless special fund, into which shall be deposited moneys designated by law." 6 SECTION 3. (a) The Hawaii public housing authority and 7 8 the department of human services shall develop a housing first 9 pilot program. The Hawaii public housing authority and the 10 department of human services shall consult with the United 11 States Department of Housing and Urban Development and community housing and homeless groups in the development process of the 12 13 housing first pilot program. 14 (b) The housing first pilot program shall be developed 15 according to the principles of housing first, specifically 16 including: 17 Moving chronically homeless individuals into housing (1)18 directly from streets and shelters, without 19 preconditions of treatment acceptance or compliance; 20 (2) Providing robust support services for program 21 participants, predicated on assertive engagement 22 instead of coercion;



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1	(3)	Continued tenancy shall not be dependent on
2		participation in services;
3	(4)	Selecting chronically homeless individuals as program
4		participants for the purpose of the pilot program, a
5		chronically homeless individual means a homeless
6		person who has an addiction or mental illness, or
7		both;
8	(5)	Embracing a harm reduction approach to addictions,
9		rather than mandating abstinence, and supporting
10		program participant commitments to recovery; and
11	(6)	Providing program participants with leases and tenant
12		protections under the law.

16	(b)	When developing the housing first pilot program, the
17	Hawaii p	ublic housing authority and the department of human
18	services	shall incorporate the following:
19	(1)	Identification of target populations, specifically the
20		chronically homeless who have an addiction or mental
21		illness disability, or both;



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1	(2)	Developing assessments for the chronically homeless
2		population;
3	(3)	Developing service components of the housing first
4		pilot program, including:
5		(A) Financial assistance;
6		(B) In-home case management services;
7		(C) Affordable housing requirements;
8		(D) Landlord cultivation;
9		(E) Housing placement requirements; and
10		(F) Support services for the purpose of moving
11		program participants to self-sufficiency and
12		independence.
13	(c)	The housing first pilot program shall establish a goal
14	of having	at least fifty participants.
15	SECT	ION 4. Beginning with the regular session of 2011, the
16	Hawaii pu	blic housing authority with the assistance of the
17	departmen	t of human services shall submit an interim annual
18	report to	the legislature on the progress of the housing first
19	pilot pro	gram no later than twenty days prior to the regular
20	session.	After the final year of the housing first pilot
21	program a	final annual report shall be submitted to the

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1	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the regular		
2	session of 2016, to include:		
3	(1) Total number of participants in the housing first		
4	pilot program;		
5	(2) Annual costs of the program;		
6	(3) Types of support services offered;		
7	(4) Number of participants, including information		
8	regarding the duration of services required for each		
9	individual; and		
10	(5) Recommendations for the continuation of the project.		
11	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the parks for		
12	homeless special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as		
13	may be necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for the housing first		
14	pilot program.		
15	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public		
16	housing authority for the purposes of this Act.		
17	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010, and		
18	shall be repealed on June 30, 2016.
