A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 271-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§271-5 Exemptions, generally. Notwithstanding any other
4	provisions of this chapter, its contents shall not apply to:
5	(1) Persons transporting their own property where the
6	transportation is in furtherance of a primary business
7	purpose or enterprise of that person, except where the
8	transportation is undertaken by a motor carrier to
9	evade the regulatory purposes of this chapter;
10	(2) Persons operating motor vehicles when engaged in the
11	transportation of school children and teachers to and
12	from school, and to and from school functions;
13	provided that these persons may engage in providing
14	transportation at special rates for groups of persons
15	belonging to an eleemosynary or benevolent
16	organization or association domiciled in this State
17	where the organization or association sponsors or is

conducting a nonregular excursion; provided that

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1		whenever the persons engage in the transportation of
2		persons other than those exempted in this paragraph,
3		that portion of their operation shall not be exempt
4		from this chapter. Nothing in this paragraph shall be
5		construed to authorize any person to engage in the
6		transportation of persons, other than the
7		transportation of persons exempted by the terms of
8		this paragraph, without a permit or certificate issued
9		by the commission authorizing such transportation;
10	(3)	Persons operating taxicabs or other motor vehicles
11	<u> </u>	utilized in performing a bona fide taxicab service.
12		"Taxicab" includes:
13		(A) Any motor vehicle used in the movement of
14		passengers on the public highways under the
15		following circumstances, namely the passenger
16		hires the vehicle on call or at a fixed stand,
17		with or without baggage for transportation, and
18		controls the vehicle to the passenger's
19		destination;
20		(B) Any motor vehicle for hire having seating
21		accommodations for eight or fewer passengers used
22		in the movement of passengers on the public

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1		highways that may, as part of a continuous trip,
2		pick up or discharge passengers from various
3		unrelated locations; provided that they shall be
4		regulated by the counties in accordance with
5		section 46-16.5(c); and provided further that
6		this subparagraph shall not apply to any
7		exclusive rights granted by the department of
8		transportation for taxicab services at facilities
9		under the department's control; and
10	(C)	Any motor vehicle having seating accommodations
11		for eight or fewer passengers used in the
12		movement of passengers on the public highways
13		between a terminal, i.e., a fixed stand, in the
14		Honolulu district, as defined in section 4-1 and
15		a terminal in a geographical district outside the
16		limits of the Honolulu district, and vice versa,
17		without picking up passengers other than at the
18		terminals or fixed stands; provided that the
19		passengers may be picked up by telephone call
20		from their homes in the rural area or may be
21		unloaded at any point between the fixed stands or

T		may be delivered to their homes in the rural
2		area;
3	(4)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
4		of persons pursuant to a franchise from the
5		legislature and whose operations are presently
6		regulated under chapter 269;
7	(5)	Nonprofit agricultural cooperative associations to the
8		extent that they engage in the transportation of their
9		own property or the property of their members;
10	(6)	Persons operating motor vehicles specially constructed
11		for the towing of disabled or wrecked vehicles but not
12		otherwise used in the transportation of property for
13		compensation or hire;
14	(7)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
15		of mail, newspapers, periodicals, magazines, messages,
16		documents, letters, or blueprints;
17	(8)	Persons operating funeral cars or ambulances;
18	[-(9) -	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
19		of garbage or refuse;
20	(10)]	(9) Persons operating the type of passenger carrying
21		motor vehicles known as "sampan buses" within the
22		radius of twenty miles from the city of Hilo, Hawaii;

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1	$\left[\frac{(11)}{(10)}\right]$ Persons transporting unprocessed pineapple to a
2	cannery, seed corn to a processing facility, or
3	returning any containers used in such transportation
4	to the fields;
5	[(12)] <u>(11)</u> Sugar plantations transporting sugarcane, raw
6	sugar, molasses, sugar by-products, and farming
7	supplies for neighboring farmers pursuant to contracts
8	administered by the United States Department of
9	Agriculture;
10	$[\frac{(13)}{(12)}]$ Persons engaged in the ranching or meat or feed
11	business who transport cattle to slaughterhouses for
12	hire where such transportation is their sole
13	transportation for hire and where their earnings from
14	the transportation constitute less than fifty per cent
15	of their gross income from their business and the
16	transportation for hire;
17	$\left[\frac{(14)}{(13)}\right]$ Persons transporting unprocessed raw milk to
18	processing plants and returning any containers used in
19	such transportation to dairy farms for reloading;
20	[(15)] <u>(14)</u> Persons transporting animal feeds to animal
21	husbandry farmers and farming supplies directly to
22	animal husbandry farmers and returning any containers

1	used in such transportation to these sources of such
2	feeds and supplies for reloading;
3	[(16)] <u>(15)</u> Persons engaged in transporting not more than
4	fifteen passengers between their places of abode, or
5	termini near such places, and their places of
6	employment in a single daily round trip where the
7	driver is also on the driver's way to or from the
8	driver's place of employment;
9	[(17)] <u>(16)</u> Persons transporting passengers without charge in
10	motor vehicles owned or operated by such person, where
11	such transportation is provided in conjunction with
12	and in furtherance of a related primary business
13	purpose or enterprise of that person, and such
14	transportation is provided only directly to and from
15	the place of business of such person, except that this
16	exemption shall not apply to persons making any
17	contract, agreement, or arrangement to provide,
18	procure, furnish, or arrange for transportation as a
19	travel agent or broker or a person engaged in tour or
20	sightseeing activities, nor shall this exemption apply
21	where the transportation is undertaken by a person to
22	evade the regulatory purposes of this chapter; and

1	$\left[\frac{(18)}{(17)}\right]$ Persons conducting the type of county-regulated
2	passenger carrying operation known as "jitney
3	services". For the purposes of this paragraph,
4	"jitney services" means public transportation services
5	utilizing motor vehicles that have seating
6	accommodations for six to twenty-five passengers,
7	operate along specific routes during defined service
8	hours, and levy a flat fare schedule."
9	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
