A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that although car rental
- 2 concessions at Hawaii's public airports contribute over
- 3 \$30,000,000 a year in concession revenues to support Hawaii's
- 4 public airports, the legislature in 2008 recognized that no
- 5 facility improvements to those concessions would be made given
- 6 other airport priorities as to the use of the funds. Thus, in
- 7 spite of years of discussion, the facilities over time have
- 8 deteriorated and have not kept pace with car-rental facilities
- 9 and services provided to visitors and residents at other public
- 10 airports across the United States.
- As a result, the legislature in 2008 passed Act 226, which
- 12 established a car-rental-facilities-charge program similar to
- 13 programs at more than one-hundred other airports across the
- 14 United States. The Act initially established a car-rental-
- 15 facility charge of \$1 per day and initially appropriated
- 16 \$10,000,000 for planning, design, and some improvements.
- 17 Recognizing the importance of the program to Hawaii's
- 18 construction industry and economy, the legislature required the

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1 department of transportation to provide annual reports and 2 timelines to ensure the "fast-tracking" of the facility projects 3 and services. 4 The department has sought to fast-track the program in keeping with the legislative directive and, with the assistance 5 6 of planners, designers, and other consultants, has completed 7 initial designs and plans for the state-wide program. The goal of this Act is to continue the fast-tracking by: 8 9 (1) Taking the program to the next level by increasing the 10 car-rental-facility charge to \$4.50 daily as 11 recommended by consultants; and **12** Making further appropriations to support the program, (2) **13** including the construction of a \$230,000,000 14 consolidated facility at Honolulu International 15 Airport and an overflow vehicle storage facility at 16 Kahului airport. **17** According to reports prepared by consultants, the increased 18 charge of \$1 daily to \$4.50 daily is expected to fund the 19 planned statewide program with no anticipated future increases.

This fee and one-time increase is comparable to similar charges

and programs at other airports. Delayed generation of revenues

by increasing such charges as proposed by some could likely

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- 1 result in the fee rising higher than \$5 daily, which must be
- 2 avoided.
- 3 The charge of \$4.50 daily and revenues generated will
- 4 strongly support both the program as well as the bonds to
- 5 finance the related construction projects, which will total
- 6 about \$500,000,000, excluding finance charges. It is very
- 7 important that the program has strong financing and the stream
- 8 of revenues to attract the buyers of the bonds during these
- 9 turbulent economic times and to avoid program delays. The one-
- 10 time-increased charge as opposed to gradual increases in charges
- 11 will also result in as much as \$300,000,000 saved in finance
- 12 costs. By fast-tracking the projects, it is anticipated that
- 13 the program will benefit from about thirty per cent to forty per
- 14 cent in construction cost savings.
- 15 As reported by consultants, the increased charge to \$4.50
- 16 daily is expected to have no negative impact as to car-rentals
- 17 at public airports or public airport revenues. Other cities and
- 18 airports have studied similar concerns, and the studies have
- 19 repeatedly found no correlation or adverse effect related to an
- 20 increased charge. In fact, airports generally have seen an
- 21 increase in revenues since the facilities attract car-rental
- 22 companies to conduct their business at the airport.

1 The program does not require visitors and residents to rent 2 a car at a public airport. Individuals will have the 3 opportunity to rent vehicles from off-airport locations and 4 thereby avoid having to pay the car-rental-facility charge. To 5 minimize the impact to travel agents and other marketing travel 6 packages and quoting prices, the legislature will delay 7 implementation of the increased car-rental-facility charge until 8 September 1, 2010. 9 While the goal of fast-tracking was to start the 10 construction of the Honolulu International Airport facility as 11 early as the first quarter of 2010 and thereby provide much-12 needed jobs and support for Hawaii's economy, the failure to 13 date of increasing the charge to \$4.50 daily has delayed the 14 implementation of this start date as well as any related sale of 15 bonds. Although the Act provides that the department has the 16 discretion to raise and adjust the car-rental-facility charge to **17** meet the program's goals notwithstanding any law to the 18 contrary, the department recently commented that the law needs 19 to be clarified and that it cannot increase charges without 20 proceeding through the rules process, which could take twelve 21 months or longer. The legislature finds that it is preferable 22 that it mandates such increased charges so that the minimum

- 1 amount of customer facility charge fees as recommended by
- 2 consultants are collected by the department no later than
- 3 September 1, 2010, to avoid and ensure there are no further
- 4 delays to the program if the department is not collecting the
- 5 minimum car-rental-facility charge fees by that date.
- 6 Some of the major purposes of this Act are to continue the
- 7 fast-tracking of this program and its projects, thereby
- 8 providing much-needed jobs to Hawaii's residents and stimulating
- 9 Hawaii's suffering economy by:
- 10 (1) Raising the initial car-rental-facility charge set by
- the legislature from \$1 daily to \$4.50 daily as
- recommended by consultants so the strength of the
- program can be maintained and so it can benefit from
- various anticipated costs savings;
- 15 (2) Removing the initial collection ceiling of car-rental-
- facility charges of \$25,000,000 so an excess of
- 17 \$500,000,000 of construction and finance costs can be
- 18 collected to fund and support the projects based upon
- 20 (3) Clarifying the law so that the department can adjust
- 21 the car-rental-facility charge without having to
- 22 establish rules; and

1	(4) Appropriating \$320,000,000 for the program for its		
2	continued fast-tracking of projects, including the		
3	construction of projects at Honolulu International		
4	Airport and Kahului airports.		
5	SECTION 2. Section 261-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:		
7	"(h) Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, the		
8	department may establish, levy, assess, and collect rental motor		
9	vehicle customer facility charges, which shall be paid to the		
10	department periodically as determined by the department[.]		
11	without regard to the requirements of chapter 91; provided that		
12	a public informational hearing shall be held for any type of		
13	rental motor vehicle charge. These charges shall be used to pay		
14	for, or finance on a long-term or other term basis where		
15	appropriate, the design, planning, construction, and other uses		
16	of the rental motor vehicle customer facility charges as set		
17	forth by the rental motor vehicle customer facility charge		
18	special fund in section 261-5.6.		
19	The rental motor vehicle customer facility charges shall be		
20	levied, assessed, and collected from all rental motor vehicle		
21	customers who benefit from the use of any type of rental motor		

- 1 vehicle facility or service provided by the department at a
- 2 state airport.
- 3 All rental motor vehicle customer facility charges shall be
- 4 collected by lessors as defined in section 437D-3 and who
- 5 operate a car rental concession awarded by the department at a
- 6 state airport; provided that customers of lessors, as defined in
- 7 section 437D-3, who do not operate a car rental concession at a
- 8 state airport but whose customers benefit from the use of a car
- 9 rental facility or service at a state airport paid for by rental
- 10 motor vehicle customer facility charges, shall collect from such
- 11 car rental customers, rental motor vehicle customer facility
- 12 charges in an amount determined by the department in its sole
- 13 discretion that represents a fair share of the cost and ongoing
- 14 expenses relating to customer use of such a facility or service,
- 15 notwithstanding any law to the contrary and without regard to
- 16 the requirements of chapter 91; provided that a public
- 17 informational hearing shall be held for any type of rental motor
- 18 vehicle charge. All rental motor vehicle customer facility
- 19 charges collected by such [lessor] lessors shall be paid to the
- 20 department and deposited into the rental motor vehicle facility
- 21 charge special fund.

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         Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department may
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    negotiate and contract the management, maintenance, and
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    operations of the facility and related services with one or more
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    airport concessions or their designee that share in the use of a
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    rental motor vehicle customer facility at a state airport."
         SECTION 3. Act 226, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
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    amended by amending sections 9 and 10 to read as follows:
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         "SECTION 9. Notwithstanding section 7 of this Act, the
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    department of transportation, as of September 1, [2008,] 2010,
    and periodically thereafter as necessary, shall levy, assess,
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    and collect a rental motor vehicle customer facility charge so
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    all such charges collected by the department total at least a
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    minimum of [$1] $4.50 per day, or any portion of a day that a
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    rental motor vehicle is rented or leased, by a rental motor
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    vehicle concession where customers pick up and return rental
    vehicles to a facility at a state airport as determined by the
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    director. Moneys shall continue to be collected only until such
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    time [that the sum of $25,000,000 is collected and deposited
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    into] as necessary to meet the needs and purposes of the rental
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    motor vehicle customer facility charge special fund.
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    provisions of this section shall not impair, limit, or restrict
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    the department of transportation from levying, assessing,
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- 1 establishing, <u>increasing</u>, lowering, and collecting rental motor
- 2 vehicle customer facility charges as set forth in section 7 of
- 3 this Act or this section; provided the above-mentioned minimum
- 4 total collections for such charges of \$4.50 per day shall not be
- 5 lowered by the department for a minimum period of at least
- 6 twenty years commencing on September 1, 2010; or until such time
- 7 as necessary to pay any bonds or financial agreements issued or
- 8 entered into to support or assist in meeting the use or purpose
- 9 of the special fund as set forth in section 261-5.6, whichever
- 10 event occurs later.
- 11 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the rental motor
- 12 vehicle customer facility charge special fund established by
- 13 section [261 /] 261-5.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of
- 14 \$10,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 15 year 2008-2009, together with extension through the fiscal year
- 16 ending on June 30, 2011, for the:
- 17 (1) Planning, conceptual design, and design of rental
- 18 motor vehicle customer facilities at state airports
- and related services; and
- 20 (2) Planning, conceptual design, design, and improvement,
- 21 pavement, lighting, construction, and fencing to an
- 22 existing ground-level storage area shared by rental

1	motor vehicle concessions at the state airport		
2	located in Kahului, Maui.		
3	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department		
4	of transportation for the purposes of this Act.		
5	Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of any appropriation		
6	made by this Act as of the close of business on June 30, 2011,		
7	shall lapse into the rental motor vehicle customer facility		
8	charge special fund."		
9	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the rental motor		
10	vehicle customer facility charge special fund established by		
11	section 261-5.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of		
12	\$320,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
13	year 2010-2011 for the:		
14	(1) Planning, design, and temporary relocation of rental		
15	motor vehicle operations and related expenses;		
16	(2) Construction costs relating to temporary relocation		
17	of current rental motor vehicle operations during		
18	the construction of a consolidated facility at the		
19	Honolulu International Airport and related expenses;		
20	(3) Planning and design of rental motor vehicle		
21	facilities at the Honolulu International Airport and		
22	related expenses;		

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1	(4)	Planning, design, and construction of an overflow
2		storage lot at Kahului Airport and related expenses
3	(5)	Initial planning and design of consolidated
4		facilities at Kahului Airport and related expenses;
5	(6)	Statewide development and program management of a
6		car rental facilities program and related expenses;
7	(7)	Construction of a consolidated rental motor vehicle
8		facility at Honolulu International Airport and
9		related expenses; and
10	(8)	Purchase of, or reimbursing of the department of
11		transportation or any department or agency of the
12		state that purchases, land near the Lihue Airport
13		for purposes of planning, design, and construction
14		of a consolidated rental motor vehicle facility.
15	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department
16	of transp	ortation for the purposes of this Act.
