A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that elections conducted
 by mail are an effective method of reducing costs and increasing
 voter participation in the election process. In recent mail only elections, many voters cast ballots early, and thus were
 not informed of the candidates' campaign contribution reports
 because state reporting deadlines are determined by the regular
 polling place elections date.

8 The purpose of this Act is to require candidates in mail-9 only elections to file campaign contribution reports prior to 10 the first day that mailed ballots may be accepted pursuant to an 11 election proclamation.

SECTION 2. Section 11-207.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

14 "(a) Each candidate, candidate's committee, or committee, 15 that within the period of fourteen calendar days through four 16 calendar days prior to a primary, special primary, general, or 17 special general election, makes contributions aggregating more

15		campaign receipts received;

21		the information is not on file, the contribution

4		contribution and the name, address, employer, and
5		occupation of each donor who contributes an
6		aggregate of \$1,000 or more during an election
7		period, which has not previously been reported;
8		provided that if all the information is not on
9.		file, the contribution shall be returned to the
10		donor within thirty days of deposit;
11	(D)	All expenditures made, incurred, or authorized by
12		or for a candidate, including the name and
13		address of each payee and the amount, date, and
14		purpose of each expenditure; and
15	(E)	A current statement of the balance on hand or
16		deficit."
17	SECTION 4	. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
18	matured, penal	ties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
19	begun before it	ts effective date.
20	SECTION 5	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
