A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that consumers are
desiring local over imported foods, and want a reliable local
food supply with better food security. The legislature also
finds that the agricultural industry will continue to be a part
of our economy and culture and has the potential to create job
opportunities through product development.

7 The legislature has determined that now is the time to 8 develop strategies to increase the availability of locally grown 9 food through product development. The purpose of this Act is to 10 create strategies to assist our agriculture industry in product 11 development.

SECTION 2. (a) There is established in the University of Hawaii at Manoa, college of tropical agriculture and human resources, an agriculture working group to assess the vertical integration of the food industry in the State, more specifically the development of agricultural products and processing plants. The working group shall be comprised of the following:



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1	(1)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the
2		chairperson's designated representative;
3	(2)	The executive director of the agribusiness development
4		corporation or the executive director's designated
5		representative;
6	(3)	The dean of the University of Hawaii at Manoa, college
7		of tropical agriculture and human resources, or the
8		dean's designated representative;
9	(4)	A representative of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation;
10	(5)	An agricultural economist; and
11	(6)	Any other representative from the agricultural
12		industry, to be selected by a majority of the working
13		group.
14	The	dean of the college of tropical agriculture and human
15	resources	, University of Hawaii at Manoa, shall be the
16	chairperson of the working group, and the University of Hawaii	
17	shall pro	vide administrative, professional, technical, and
18	clerical	support required by the working group.
19	(b)	The primary task of the agriculture working group
· 20	shall be	to assess the following:
21	(1)	The current availability and condition of the
22		industry-wide processing structures on each major



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1		island, including processing plants, vacuum cooling
2	۱.	plants, slaughter houses, and packaging plans;
3	(2)	The availability of financial capital support to help
4		the State's agricultural industry to develop
5		processing structures;
6	(3)	The availability of accurate and current data and
7		trade statistics, including current market prices and
8		trends, for various agricultural products produced and
9		consumed in the State and exported out of the State;
10		and
11	(4)	Any other areas or matters that require consideration
12		and assessment by the working group to benefit the
13		production of agricultural products in the State.
14	SECT	TON 3. The agriculture working group shall provide to
15	the legis	lature:
16	(1)	An interim report of its findings, along with any
17		proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior
18		to the convening of the regular session of 2011; and
19	(2)	A final report of its findings and conclusions, along
20		with any proposed legislation, no later than twenty
21		days prior to the convening of the regular session of
22		2012.
