A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a viable agriculture 2 industry in Hawaii requires the support and commitment of state 3 government. The legislature continues to support the work of the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts. 4 The Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts is an 5 association of sixteen local soil and water conservation 7 districts in Hawaii: Kauai (2); Oahu (3); Molokai/Lanai (1); Maui (4); and the Big Island (6). The Hawaii Association of 8 9 Conservation Districts pools district experience and knowledge 10 to develop policies, provide technical and educational resources 11 to agricultural land users, and encourage use of best management 12 practices to mitigate soil erosion and water pollution. While the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts has 13 14 been tasked to develop many soil and water conservation plans, 15 they do not have the staffing or resources necessary to 16 implement these tasks in a timely fashion. The directors of the 17 respective boards are volunteers and many directors donate their

personal money to help cover expenses. Each of the districts

- 1 receives minimal funding annually (\$2360) to cover expenses for
- 2 administering the duties of the volunteer directors. These
- 3 funds cover business expenses, travel, and other costs. Any
- 4 unused money not expended by each district is required to be
- 5 returned to the state general fund at the end of each fiscal
- 6 year.
- 7 The legislature finds that to assist local soil and water
- 8 conservation districts carry out their designated duties, they
- 9 should be able to maintain and carry-over any unexpended non-
- 10 general funds for operational purposes to complete their duties.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to amend the law to allow local
- 12 soil and conservation districts to keep their donations and
- 13 grants to pay for operating expenses and special projects.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 180-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$180-16 Budget. The department of land and natural
- 17 resources shall submit to the director of finance, annually the
- 18 budgetary estimates and information required by chapter 37, and
- 19 shall include therein estimates of the financial requirements of
- 20 the department. All contributions, moneys, and funds received
- 21 by any district shall be [deposited to the credit of the state
- 22 general fund.] used to carry out the duties of the districts as



- 1 identified in section 180-13. Any general fund appropriation
- 2 unused at the end of each fiscal year shall be deposited to the
- 3 credit of the state general fund."
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
