A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that each county was 2 required to submit to the office of solid waste management in 3 the department of health an integrated solid waste management plan for review no later than July 1, 1995. Thereafter, 4 5 counties are required to submit revised plans to the office of 6 solid waste management once every five years, and as necessary. However, the legislature finds that the required interval of 7 8 five years does not provide adequate time for analyzing and 9 predicting solid waste trends, which would help provide more 10 accurate planning. The process of analyzing one complete year 11 of data and organizing and writing a revised plan from start to 12 completion, can take well over two years, with the result that counties work continuously to update their plans throughout the 13 14 five year period.

15 The purpose of this Act is to extend from five years to ten 16 years the required interval for a county to submit a revised 17 integrated solid waste management plan.

| 6 | office not later than four years after July 1, 1991; |

| 8 | (2) Subsequent revised plans shall be submitted to the |
| 9 | office once every [five years.] ten years. |
| 10 | All revised plans shall be consistent with the requirements of |
| 11 | this chapter." |
| 12 | SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed |
| 13 | and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. |
| 14 | SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. |
