A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 13-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:
 "§13-1 Board members; number. [-(a)-] The board of
 education shall consist of [thirteen] seventeen voting members

5 who shall be elected by the registered voters of [two at-large]

6 the respective school board districts [as follows:

7 First-school board district: the island of Oahu, comprised 8 of the-11th through the 48th and a portion of the 49th (that 9 portion found on the island of Oahu) representative districts, 10 and the

Second school board district: the islands of Hawaii, Maui, 11 12 Lanai, Molokai, Kahoolawe, Kauai, and Niihau, comprised of the 13 1st through the 10th, a portion of the 49th (that portion found 14 on the island of Kauai), and the 50th and 51st representative 15 districts]. Each school board district shall be comprised of 16 three state house of representatives districts. A voting member shall be a resident of the school board district that the member 17 18 represents. The chief election officer shall designate the

1	representative districts that comprise the respective school
2	board districts.
3	[(b)Ten members shall be elected at large from the first
4	school board district. Of the ten members elected at-large-from
5	that-district, one shall be a resident of the third departmental
6	school district (Honolulu), one shall be a resident of the
7	fourth departmental school district (Central Oahu), one shall be
8	a resident of the fifth departmental school district (Leeward
9	Oahu), and one shall be a resident of the sixth departmental
10	school district (Windward Oahu).
11	(c) Three members shall be elected at large from the
12	second school board district. Of the three members elected at-
13	large-from that-district, one-shall be-a resident of the first
14	departmental school-district (Hawaii), one shall be a resident
15	of-the second departmental school district (Maui), and one-shall
16	be a-resident of the seventh-departmental-school district
17	(Kauai).
18	(d) The departmental school districts shall be as follows:
19	First-departmental-school district (Hawaii): the island-of
20	Hawaii comprised of the 1st through the 5th and a-portion of the
21	6th (that portion found on the island of Hawaii) representative
22	districts;

1 SECTION 2. Section 13-1.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[4] \$13-1.1[4] Reapportionment. Upon the implementation of a new apportionment plan, the chief election officer, by 4 5 proclamation issued no later than the tenth day prior to the 6 close of filing in elections, shall designate the representative 7 districts that comprise the [departmental school districts and 8 the] school board districts [described in section 13-1] to 9 comply with the new districting scheme of such plan [- provided 10 that the departmental school districts designated shall cover 11 areas-similar to those described in section 13 1]."

12 SECTION 3. Section 13-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows:

14 "§13-3 Election of members. (a) Members of the board of 15 education shall be nominated at a primary election and elected 16 at the general election. Except as otherwise provided by this 17 chapter, the candidates for the board of education shall be 18 elected in the manner prescribed by this title.

19 (1) Nomination papers, preparation of. The chief election
 20 officer shall prepare nomination papers [in such a
 21 manner-that a candidate desiring to file for election
 22 to the board of education shall be able to specify



1 whether the candidate is seeking a seat requiring 2 residency in a particular departmental school-district .3 or a seat without such residency requirement.] (2)The school board ballot shall be prepared in 4 Ballot. such a manner as to afford every voter eligible to 5 vote in a school board district race the opportunity 6 to vote for each and every candidate seeking election 7 from that school board district. 8 The school board ballot shall contain the names 9 of all board candidates [arranged alphabetically in a 10 nonpartisan manner; provided that the names of 11 candidates seeking seats requiring residency in a 12 particular departmental school district shall be 13 grouped] arranged alphabetically in a nonpartisan 14 manner according to [departmental] school [districts.] 15 16 board district. (3) Primary election. Two candidates receiving the most 17 votes for each available seat shall be nominated for 18 the general election. If, after the close of filing 19 of nomination papers, there are only two qualified 20 21 candidates for any seat requiring residency in a particular [departmental] school board district, the 22

chief election officer shall declare those two
 candidates duly nominated for the general election.
 The names of those two candidates shall not appear on
 the primary election ballot.

5 (4) General election. Each voter in the general election
6 shall be entitled to receive the school board ballot
7 and to vote for the number of seats available in the
8 respective school board districts.

9 (b) In the event that there is only one qualified 10 candidate for [any] the seat [requiring residency] in a 11 particular [departmental] school board district, after the close 12 of filing of nomination papers, the chief election officer shall 13 declare such candidate to be duly and legally elected. [In the event that the number of qualified candidates for seats without 14 such residency requirement is equal to or less than the number 15 of such seats to be filled, after the close of filing of 16 17 nomination papers, the chief election officer shall declare such 18 candidates to be duly and legally elected.] "

19 SECTION 4. Section 13-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

21 "(c) Members of the board elected at the special election
22 held in conjunction with the general election in [1984] 2010

1 shall be divided into two classes. There shall be [seven] nine 2 members in the first class who shall hold office for a term of 3 four years beginning with their election and ending on the day 4 of the special election held in conjunction with the second 5 general election after their election. The remaining members 6 shall comprise the second class and shall hold office for a term 7 of two years beginning with their election and ending on the day 8 of the special election held in conjunction with the next 9 general election after their election, and then members of the 10 second class shall be elected to four year terms.

11 Membership in the first class shall consist of [+ three 12 members who are elected with the highest number of votes from 13 the first school board district as designated under section 13-14 1, who are not required to reside in any particular departmental 15 school-district and one member-elected from each] the school 16 board members from the odd-numbered [departmental] school board 17 [district.] districts. Membership of the second class shall consist of the remaining elected school board members." 18 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 21 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
