A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRACTICE OF PHARMACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending the definition of "practice of pharmacy" to
read as follows:

4 "Practice of pharmacy" means:

5 (1)The interpretation and evaluation of prescription 6 orders; the compounding, dispensing, and labeling of 7 drugs and devices (except labeling by a manufacturer, 8 packer, or distributor of nonprescription drugs and 9 commercially legend drugs and devices); the 10 participation in drug selection and drug utilization 11 reviews; the proper and safe storage of drugs and 12 devices and the maintenance of proper records 13 [therefore;] therefor; the responsibility for advising 14 when necessary or where regulated, of therapeutic 15 values, content, hazards, and use of drugs and 16 devices;

17 (2) Performing the following procedures or functions as
18 part of the care provided by and in concurrence with a HB HMS 2010-1259



1 "health care facility" and "health care service" as 2 defined in section 323D-2, or a "pharmacy" or a 3 licensed physician, or a "managed care plan" as 4 defined in section 432E-1, in accordance with 5 policies, procedures, or protocols developed 6 collaboratively by health professionals, including 7 physicians and surgeons, pharmacists, and registered nurses, and for which a pharmacist has received 8 9 appropriate training required by these policies, 10 procedures, or protocols: 11 (A) Ordering or performing routine drug therapy 12 related patient assessment procedures; 13 (B) Ordering drug therapy related laboratory tests; 14 (C) Initiating emergency contraception oral drug 15 therapy in accordance with a written 16 collaborative agreement approved by the board 17 between a licensed physician and a pharmacist who 18 has received appropriate training that includes 19 programs approved by the American Council of 20 Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE), curriculum-based 21 programs from an ACPE-accredited college of 22 pharmacy, state or local health department

3	(D)	Administering drugs orally, topically, by
4		intranasal delivery, or by injection, pursuant to

9		college of pharmacy, state or local health
10		department programs, or programs recognized by

13		or by intranasal delivery, to persons <u>at least</u>
14		nine years of age with parental consent or
15		eighteen years of age or older, by a pharmacist
16		having appropriate training that includes
17		programs approved by the ACPE, curriculum-based
18		programs from an ACPE-accredited college of
19		pharmacy, state or local health department
20		programs, or programs recognized by the board of
21		pharmacy;
