A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRACTICE OF PHARMACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

amended by amending the definition of "practice of pharmacy" to

read as follows:

4 ""Practice of pharmacy" means:

- 5 The interpretation and evaluation of prescription (1) 6 orders; the compounding, dispensing, and labeling of 7 drugs and devices (except labeling by a manufacturer, 8 packer, or distributor of nonprescription drugs and 9 commercially legend drugs and devices); the 10 participation in drug selection and drug utilization 11 reviews; the proper and safe storage of drugs and 12 devices and the maintenance of proper records 13 [therefore;] therefor; the responsibility for advising 14 when necessary or where regulated, of therapeutic 15 values, content, hazards, and use of drugs and devices; 16
 - (2) Performing the following procedures or functions as part of the care provided by and in concurrence with a

5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 2020;
7	provided that the amendments made to the definition of "practice
8	of pharmacy" in section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by this
9	Act shall not be repealed when section 461-1, Hawaii Revised
10	Statutes, is reenacted on July 1, 2010, pursuant to section 11
11	of Act 190, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004.

Description:

Amends the definition of "practice of pharmacy" by allowing immunizations to be administered to persons who are at least nine years of age with parental consent contingent upon the Governor's determination of a public health necessity. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB2464 HD2)

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
