RELATING TO DEATH BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 346-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 [Burial of] Death benefits for deceased medical or financial assistance recipients [or] and disposition of 5 unclaimed corpses. (a) Where the decedent was a medical or financial assistance recipient at the time of death and is 6 ineligible for the Social Security Lump-Sum Death Benefit, [The] 7 8 the department of human services may [bear-the cost of the burial of deceased medical or financial assistance recipients or 9 unclaimed corpses. Burial services include the customary 10 mortuary, crematory, cemetery, and other services essential in 11 12 providing a dignified burial.] issue a lump-sum death benefit in an amount equal to the Social Security Administration's Lump-Sum 13 Death Benefit for that year. 14 (b) [The department may pay for mortuary and erematory 15 services to be furnished by any licensed provider of mortuary 16 and crematory services. Mortuary and crematory payments shall 17 be made to the extent of cost, or in the sum of \$400, whichever 18

is less.] The department may authorize and bear the cost of the mortuary and crematory services for unclaimed corpses furnished 2 3 by any licensed provider of mortuary or crematory services. Payments for mortuary and crematory services shall be made to 4 the extent of cost, or in the sum of \$800 in total, whichever is 5 6 less, for each unclaimed corpse. [(c) The department may pay for cemetery services, to be 7 furnished by any licensed provider of cemetery services. 8 9 Cemetery payments shall be made to the extent of cost, or in the sum of \$400, whichever is less. 10 (d) In cases where the decedent is survived by relatives, 11 the relatives shall be permitted to make their own arrangements 12 for the burial or cremation of their deceased relative.] 13 14 (c) The person submitting an application for funeral payments under the department's funeral payment program, 15 Any person submitting an application for the lump-sum death 16 benefit described in subsection (a) on behalf of a deceased 17 medical or financial assistance recipient, shall have sixty days 18 from the date of the death of the deceased to submit the 19 20 application [for funeral payments] to the department. 21 subsection shall not apply to applications submitted by the

Description:

To provide a State lump-sum death benefit in an amount equal to the Social Security Administration's Lump-Sum Death Benefit for deceased medical or financial assistance recipients who are ineligible for the Social Security Administration benefit.

PURPOSE:

To use the federal Social Security

Administration's Lump-Sum Death Benefit as a model to restructure and right-size the State's funeral payment benefit for medical

and financial assistance recipients.

MEANS:

Amend section 346-15, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The federal Social Security Administration currently provides a lump-sum death benefit of \$255 to surviving relatives of eligible individuals who have 40 quarters of work history or are receiving monthly Social Security benefits.

DHS currently provides a fully state-funded funeral payment of up to \$800 to surviving relatives to defray the mortuary and burial services costs for medical and financial assistance recipients who do not qualify for a federal death benefit at the time of their death.

The proposed amendment will require the State to provide a lump-sum death benefit identical to the federal Social Security Administration's lump-sum death benefit. This change will result in an estimated cost savings of approximately \$430,000 in state funds per year, as well as bring parity in the level of government assistance provided to all medical and financial assistance recipients.

This bill also simplifies the eligibility determination process.



The disposition of unclaimed bodies and costs remains unchanged in this proposed bill.

Impact on the public: The proposed amendment will ensure a standard of equal treatment of both state and federal

governmental benefits.

Impact on the department and other agencies: None.

GENERAL FUND:

The proposed amendment will decrease annual state fund expenditures by approximately \$430,000.
