## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 291-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by amending the definitions of "issuing agency" and			
3	"removable windshield placard" to read as follows:			
4	""Issuing agency" means [ <del>an agency authorized by a county</del>			
5	to issue removable windshield placards, temporary-removable			
6	windshield placards, special license plates, and identification			
7	cards pursuant to this part] the disability and communication			
8	access board.			
9	"Removable windshield placard" means a two-sided, hanger-			
10	style placard issued under this part to a person with a			
11	disability who presents a certificate of disability that			
12	verifies that the applicant's disability is expected to last for			
13	at least [ <del>four</del> ] <u>six</u> years."			
14	SECTION 2. Section 291-51.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
15	amended to read as follows:			
16	"§291-51.3 Reimbursement to counties. The State shall			
17	reimburse the counties for the unit cost of issuing a removable			
18	windshield placard or a temporary removable windshield placard HB2574 HD2 HMS 2010-1857			

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1	on behalf of the State. [ <del>Beginning July 1, 2006, the rate of</del>
2	the-per unit cost reimbursement shall be \$12. All fees
3	collected by the counties for issuing removable and temporary
4	removable windshield placards shall be deposited into the state
5	general fund.] The reimbursement rate to the counties to issue
6	removable and temporary removable windshield placards on behalf
7.	of the issuing agency shall be established by rules adopted
8	pursuant to section 291-56. The counties shall retain any fees
9	collected by the counties."
10	SECTION 3. Section 291-51.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

13	placards. [Each county] The issuing agency shall issue one
14	temporary removable windshield placard [and a second temporary
15	removable-windshield placard] to each applicant who [requests
16	and] presents a certificate of disability that verifies the
17	duration of the applicant's disability in monthly increments,
18	which shall not exceed six months, and upon payment of a fee [ $to$
19	the issuing agency. All fees collected by the counties for
20	issuing-temporary removable windshield-placards shall be
21	deposited into the state general fund. The temporary removable
22	windshield-placard shall be designed, fabricated, and sold to
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1 the counties at a rate negotiated by the disability and 2 communication access board]. A second temporary removable 3 windshield placard shall be issued upon the request of the 4 applicant." 5 SECTION 4. Section 291-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 "§291-52 Issuance of removable windshield placard. [Each 8 county] The issuing agency shall issue one removable windshield 9 placard [and a second removable windshield placard] to each 10 applicant who [so requests and] presents a certificate of 11 disability that verifies that the applicant's disability is 12 expected to last for at least [four] six years. The removable 13 windshield placard shall expire [four] six years after the date 14 of its issuance. [The removable windshield placard shall be 15 designed, fabricated, and sold to the counties at a rate 16 negotiated by the disability and communication access board.] А 17 second removable windshield placard shall be issued upon the 18 request of the applicant." 19 SECTION 5.
