A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VESSELS AT ALA WAI AND KEEHI BOAT HARBORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(c) The permittee shall pay moorage fees to the
4	department for the use permit that shall be based on, but not
5	limited to, the use of the vessel, its effect on the harbor, use
6	of facilities, and the cost of administering this mooring
7	program; and, furthermore:
8	(1) Moorage fees shall be established by the department
9	[and shall be higher for nonresidents];
10	(2) An application fee shall be collected when applying
11	for moorage in state small boat harbors and shall
12	thereafter be collected annually when the application
13	is renewed. The application fee shall be:
14	(A) Set by the department; and
15	(B) Not less than \$100 for nonresidents;
16	(3) If a recreational vessel is used as a place of
17	principal habitation, the permittee shall pay, in



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1		addition to the moorage fee, a liveaboard fee that		
2		shall be calculated at a rate of:		
3		(A)	\$5.20 a foot of vessel length a month if the	
4			permittee is a state resident; provided that for	
5			vessels at Ala Wai and Keehi boat harbors, the	
6			liveaboard fee shall be three times the moorage	
7			fee assessed per month for a recreational vessel	
8			of the same size; and	
9		(B)	\$7.80 a foot of vessel length a month if the	
10			permittee is a nonresident; provided that for	
11			vessels at Ala Wai and Keehi boat harbors, the	
12			liveaboard fee shall be three and one-half times	
13			the moorage fee assessed per month for a	
14			recreational vessel of the same size;	
15		prov	ided that the liveaboard fees established by this	
16		para	graph may be increased by the department at the	
17		rate	of the annual cost-of-living index, but not more	
18		than	five per cent in any one year, beginning	
19		Janu	ary 1 of each year; and	
20	(4)	If a	vessel is used for commercial purposes from its	
21		perm	itted mooring, the permittee shall pay, in lieu of	
22		the	moorage and liveaboard fee, a fee based on three	



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per cent of the gross revenues derived from the use of the vessel or two times the moorage fee assessed for a recreational vessel of the same size, whichever is greater." SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
