A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL AND REHABILITATION BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 386-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) Whenever medical care is needed, the injured employee
4	may select any physician or surgeon who is practicing on the
5	island where the injury was incurred to render medical care.
6	The physician or surgeon may conduct diagnostic testing or
7	engage in a one-time consultation with a board-certified or
8	licensed specialist to obtain a subspecialty diagnostic
9	evaluation and treatment recommendation; provided that the
10	request for, or provision of the diagnostic services may not be
11	contested by an insurer or employer. If the services of a
12	specialist are indicated, the employee may select any physician
13	or surgeon practicing in the State. The director may authorize
14	the selection of a specialist practicing outside the State where
15	no comparable medical attendance within the State is available.
16	Upon procuring the services of a physician or surgeon, the
17	injured employee shall give proper notice of the employee's
18	selection to the employer within a reasonable time after the

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- 1 beginning of the treatment. If for any reason during the period
- 2 when medical care is needed, the employee wishes to change to
- 3 another physician or surgeon, the employee may do so in
- 4 accordance with rules prescribed by the director. If the
- 5 employee is unable to select a physician or surgeon and the
- 6 emergency nature of the injury requires immediate medical
- 7 attendance, or if the employee does not desire to select a
- 8 physician or surgeon and so advises the employer, the employer
- 9 shall select the physician or surgeon. The selection, however,
- 10 shall not deprive the employee of the employee's right of
- 11 subsequently selecting a physician or surgeon for continuance of
- 12 needed medical care."
- 13 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
