### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 1 SECTION 1. by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 2 3 read as follows: "§11- Elections commission; direct recourse to the 4 5 supreme court. The elections commission, through its chief election officer, may institute, or intervene as a party in, any 6 7 action in the supreme court seeking a writ of mandamus or prohibition, or injunctive or other relief, to compel compliance 8 9 with this chapter, any rule or order adopted thereunder, or any 10 provision of the constitution relating to elections, or to 11 restrain or otherwise prevent or prohibit any illegal or unauthorized conduct in connection therewith." 12 SECTION 2. Section 11-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: "§11-2 Chief election officer; duties. (a) The chief 15 16 election officer shall supervise all state elections. The chief election officer may delegate responsibilities in state 17

elections within a county to the clerk of that county or to
 other specified persons.

The chief election officer shall be responsible for 3 (b) 4 the maximization of registration of eligible electors throughout the State. In maximizing registration, the chief election 5 officer shall make an effort to equalize registration between 6 districts, with particular effort in those districts in which 7 the chief election officer determines registration is lower than 8 9 desirable. The chief election officer, in carrying out this 10 function, may make surveys, carry on house-to-house canvassing, 11 and assist or direct the clerk in any other area of 12 registration.

(c) The chief election officer shall maintain data concerning registered voters, elections, apportionment, and districting. The chief election officer shall use this data to assist the reapportionment commission provided for under Article IV of the Constitution.
