A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that veterans who have 2 acquired skill levels while serving in the military may qualify 3 for civilian employment requiring similar skill levels and 4 experience in the private sector. Section 286-235.5, Hawaii 5 Revised Statutes, recognizes military skill levels that exempt 6 certain active duty military personnel from the requirement to 7 obtain a commercial driver's license. 8 The purpose of this Act is to similarly exempt certain 9 former military personnel no longer on active duty from the 10 requirement to obtain a commercial driver's license. 11 SECTION 2. Section 286-235.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: "§286-235.5 Persons exempt from licensure. The following 13 14 persons shall be exempt from licensure under this part: 15 (1)Individuals who operate or previously operated 16 commercial motor vehicles for military purposes. This 17 exception is limited to active-duty military 18 personnel, current members of the military reserves,

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1 and the commercial motor vehicles are equipped with audible and visual signals and are not subject to 2 3 normal traffic regulation. For purposes of this 4 paragraph, "authorized emergency vehicle" shall have the same meaning as in section 291C-1." 5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 6 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Commercial Driver's License; Exemption for Veterans
