# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KAHO'OLAWE ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 6K, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	"§6K- Procurement; exemptions. Contracts made by the
5	commission for the procurement of food or fuel products
6	necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter shall be
7	exempt from chapter 103D; provided that the commission shall
8	continue to comply with any reporting requirements under chapter
9	103D or rules adopted thereunder for contracts entered into
10	pursuant to this section."
11	SECTION 2. Section 103D-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
13	"(c) Notwithstanding subsection (a), this chapter shall
14	not apply to contracts made by [any]:
15	(1) Any regional system board of the Hawaii health systems
16	corporation[-]; or
17	(2) The Kahoʻolawe island reserve commission, except as
18	provided by section 6K"

- 10 Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which it
- 11 read on the day before the effective date of Act 175, Session
- 12 Laws of Hawaii 2009.
