does not have a valid permit under sections 132D-10 1 2 and 132D-16, shall be guilty of a class C felony; and 3 Who removes or extracts the pyrotechnic contents from (4)any fireworks or articles pyrotechnic and uses the 4 5 contents to construct fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or a fireworks or articles pyrotechnic related device 6 7 shall be guilty of a [misdemeanor.] class C felony. 8 Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise (b) 9 specifically provided for in this chapter, any person violating 10 any other provision of this chapter, shall be fined not more than [<del>\$2,000</del>] \$10,000 for each violation." 11

SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.
