A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRONIC MONITORING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 846E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 3 to read as follows: 4 "PART 5 ELECTRONIC MONITORING FOR CERTAIN SEX OFFENDERS 6 \$846E-A Electronic monitoring; obligation. (a) 7 addition to the registration requirements of this chapter, a 8 covered offender shall also be subject to electronic monitoring 9 as mandated by this part. The obligation to be subject to 10 electronic monitoring shall run concurrently with the obligation 11 to provide sex offender registration. 12 The attorney general shall use a system of active 13 electronic monitoring that identifies the location of a 14 monitored offender and that can produce, upon request, reports 15 or records of the offender's presence near or within a crime 16 scene or prohibited area or the offender's departure from 17 specified geographic limitations, produces an audible alarm upon

damage of a degree that would render location identification

- 3 §846E-B Periodic maintenance of electronic monitoring
- 4 device; damage. (a) Unless the covered offender is
- 5 incarcerated or has registered with a designated law enforcement
- 6 agency after establishing residence in another state, every five
- 7 years, the covered offender shall report in person to the
- 8 attorney general for periodic maintenance of the electronic
- 9 monitoring device.
- 10 (b) In the event of damage to the electronic monitoring
- 11 device of a degree that would render location identification
- 12 inoperative, the covered offender shall immediately inform the
- 13 attorney general's office of such damage and, within four hours
- 14 of such damage, report in person to the attorney general, or
- 15 their designee, for repair or replacement of the device.
- 16 §846E-C Termination of electronic monitoring
- 17 requirements. (a) A successful petition for termination of
- 18 registration requirements under section 846E-10 shall also
- 19 terminate all electronic monitoring requirements.
- 20 (b) No separate petition for termination of electronic
- 21 monitoring requirements shall be made to a court."

5	(a) A pe	rson commits the offense of failure to comply with
6	covered o	ffender registration and electronic monitoring
7	requireme	nts if the person is required to register under this
8	chapter a	nd the person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:
9	(1)	Fails to register with the attorney general by
10		providing to the attorney general or the Hawaii
11		criminal justice data center the person's registration
12		information;
13	(2)	Fails to report in person every five years until June
14		30, 2009, and beginning on July 1, 2009, once every
15		year, during the thirty-day period following the
16		offender's date of birth, to the chief of police where
17		the covered offender's residence is located, or to
18		such other department or agency designated by the
19		attorney general;
20	(3)	While reporting to the chief of police or such other
21		department or agency designated by the attorney
22		general, fails to correct information in the registry

1		within the offender's knowledge that has changed or is
2		inaccurate regarding information required by section
3		846E-2(d)(1) through (12);
4	(4)	While reporting to the chief of police or such other
5		department or agency designated by the attorney
6		general, fails to provide new information that may be
7		required by section 846E-2(d)(1) through (12);
8	(5)	While reporting to the chief of police or such other
9		department or agency designated by the attorney
10		general, does not allow the police or other designated
11		department or agency to take a current photograph of
12		the person;
13	(6)	Fails to register in person with the chief of police
14		having jurisdiction of the area where the covered
15		offender resides or is present within three working
16		days whenever the provisions of section 846E-2(g)
17		require the person to do so;
18	(7)	Fails to notify the attorney general or the Hawaii
19		criminal justice data center of a change of any of the
20		covered offender's registration information in writing
21		within three working days of the change;

1	(8)	Provides false registration information to the
2		attorney general, the Hawaii criminal justice data
3		center, or a chief of police;
4	(9)	Signs a statement verifying that all of the
5		registration information is accurate and current when
6		any of the registration information is not
7		substantially accurate and current;
8	(10)	Having failed to establish a new residence within the
9		ten days while absent from the person's registered
10		residence for ten or more days:
11		(A) Fails to notify the attorney general in writing
12		within three working days that the person no
13		longer resides at the person's registered
14		residence; or
15		(B) Fails to report to a police station in the State
16		by the last day of every month; [ex]
17	(11)	Fails to mail or deliver the periodic verification of
18		registration information form to the attorney general
19		within ten days of receipt, as required by section
20		846E-5; provided that it shall be an affirmative
21		defense that the periodic verification form mailed to
22		the covered offender was delivered when the covered

1		offender was absent from the registered address and
2		the covered offender had previously notified the
3		Hawaii criminal justice data center that the covered
4		offender would be absent during the period that the
5		periodic verification form was delivered; or
6	(12)	Fails to appear before the attorney general to submit
7		to electronic monitoring;
8	(13)	Fails to report in person every five years before the
9		attorney general, or their designee, for maintenance
10		on the electronic monitoring device;
11	(14)	Fails to report in person, within four hours, before
12		the attorney general, or their designee, for repair or
13		replacement of the electronic monitoring device in the
14		event of damage to the electronic monitoring device of
15		a degree that would render location identification
16		inoperative; or
17	(15)	Inflicts damage to the electronic monitoring device to
18		a degree that would render location identification
19		inoperative.
20	[-(b) -]	(c) Failure to comply with covered offender
21	registrat:	ion and electronic monitoring requirements is a class
22	[C] <u>A</u> felo	ony, provided the court shall sentence the person who
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- 1 has been convicted of this offense to a minimum term of
- 2 imprisonment of not less than twenty years without the
- 3 possibility of probation or suspension of sentence."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun, before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
