### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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Place, or cooperate in placing, abused or neglected 1 (5) 2 children in suitable private homes or institutions and place, or cooperate in placing, children in suitable 3 4 adoptive homes; Have authority to establish, maintain, and operate 5 (6) 6 receiving homes for the temporary care and custody of 7 abused or neglected children until suitable plans are 8 made for their care; and accept from the police and 9 other agencies, for temporary care and custody, any 10 abused or neglected child until satisfactory plans are 11 made for the child; 12 (7) Administer the medical assistance programs for eligible public welfare and other medically needy 13 14 individuals by establishing standards, eligibility, and health care participation rules, payment 15 methodologies, reimbursement allowances, systems to 16 17 monitor recipient and provider compliance, and 18 assuring compliance with federal requirements to 19 maximize federal financial participation; provided 20 that on June 30, 2011, the department shall terminate 21 QUEST and shall resume the public assistance programs that were replaced by QUEST, including, but not 22



1 limited to, the state health insurance program; 2 provided further that those previous programs have 3 similar benefits as QUEST; Cooperate with the federal government in carrying out 4 (8) 5 the purposes of the Social Security Act and in other 6 matters of mutual concern pertaining to public 7 welfare, public assistance, and child welfare 8 services, including the making of reports, the 9 adoption of methods of administration, and the making 10 of rules as are found by the federal government, or 11 any properly constituted authority thereunder, to be 12 necessary or desirable for the efficient operation of 13 the plans for public welfare, assistance, and child 14 welfare services or as may be necessary or desirable 15 for the receipt of financial assistance from the 16 federal government; 17 (9) Carry on research and compile statistics relative to 18 public and private welfare activities throughout the 19 State, including those dealing with dependence, 20 defectiveness, delinquency, and related problems;



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1 Develop plans in cooperation with other public and (10)2 private agencies for the prevention and treatment of 3 conditions giving rise to public welfare problems; Adopt rules governing the procedure in hearings, 4 (11)5 investigations, recording, registration, determination 6 of allowances, and accounting and conduct other 7 activities as may be necessary or proper to carry out 8 this chapter; 9 (12)Supervise or administer any other activities 10 authorized or required by this chapter, including the 11 development of the staff of the department through in-12 service training and educational leave to attend 13 schools and other appropriate measures, and any other 14 activities placed under the jurisdiction of the 15 department by any other law; 16 (13)Make, prescribe, and enforce policies and rules 17 governing the activities provided for in section 346-18 31 it deems advisable, including the allocation of 19 moneys available for assistance to persons assigned to 20 work projects among the several counties or to 21 particular projects where the apportionment has not



been made pursuant to other provisions of law, if any, 1 2 governing expenditures of the funds; 3 Determine the appropriate level for the Hawaii (14)4 security net, by developing a tracking and monitoring 5 system to determine what segments of the population 6 are not able to afford the basic necessities of life, 7 and advise the legislature annually regarding the 8 resources required to maintain the security net at the 9 appropriate level; 10 (15)Subject to the appropriation of state funds and 11 availability of federal matching assistance, expand 12 optional health care to low-income persons as follows: 13 Pregnant women and infants under one year of age (A) 14 living in families with incomes up to one hundred 15 eighty-five per cent of the federal poverty level 16 and without any asset restrictions; 17 Children under six years of age living in (B) 18 families with incomes up to one hundred thirty-19 three per cent of the federal poverty level and 20 without any asset restrictions; 21 Older children to the extent permitted under (C) 22 optional federal medicaid rules;
