### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§132D-Private and public property; liability. (a) 5 Ownership of private property on which a violation requiring a 6 license or permit under this chapter occurs shall be prima facie 7 evidence that the owner is guilty of the violation. 8 (b) When a violation of this chapter occurs on public 9 property, it shall be prima facie evidence that any person who 10 is within ten feet of the violation during its commission, is 11 guilty of the violation." 12 SECTION 2. Section 132D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 "§132D-7 License or permit required. A person shall not: 15 Import, store, offer to sell, or sell, at wholesale or (1)16 retail, aerial devices, display fireworks, articles 17 pyrotechnic, or consumer fireworks unless the person 18 has a valid license issued by the county; provided LRB 10-0875.doc

17	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
