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#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§132D-</u> Illegal fireworks reporting; reward program.		
5	(a) The counties shall establish a reward program for		
6	individuals who report violations of this chapter.		
7	(b) Any person who reports a violation of this chapter to		
8	a state or county law enforcement authority may collect a reward		
9	if the reported violator is convicted of the violation and		
10	ordered by the court to pay a fine; provided that:		
11	(1) The reward shall be up to \$10,000; and		
12	(2) Payment of the reward shall be made not later than		
13	thirty days after payment of the fine by the		
14	violator."		
15	SECTION 2. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
16	amended to read as follows:

Section 132D-20, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: "§132D-20 Enforcement, [This chapter shall be enforced by 15 16 each county.] The counties [are authorized to enforce and] 17 shall administer the provisions of this chapter [-] relating to permits, licenses, and application and fees therefor. The 18 19 provisions of this chapter relating to prohibited conduct may be enforced by any state or county law enforcement officer." 20 21 SECTION 6.
