A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is
2	undergoing a significant and possibly protracted economic
3	downturn in tandem with the national and global economic and
4	financial crises. Numerous jobs have been lost, a number of
5	large and small companies have declared bankruptcy or left the
6	State, and many families have suffered foreclosure on their
7	heavily mortgaged houses. In the past year, the council on
8	revenues has consistently reduced its forecasts of Hawaii's tax
9	revenues. Across-the-board spending restrictions have already
10	been put in place in state government, and a general hiring
11	freeze has already been implemented except in areas that impact
12	public health and safety.
13	In recognition of this situation throughout the United
14	States, there is widely expected a federal economic stimulus
15	package of aid for distribution to the states. In anticipation

of these federal funds, the legislature finds that it is

necessary to prioritize the use of these moneys to address the

State's critical environmental needs.

1 Following the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the 2 emergency environmental workforce was created within the 3 Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii to employ 4 persons who lost their jobs in the subsequent economic downturn. 5 The legislature finds that a similar emergency workforce 6 development program is again required to provide employment for 7 persons affected by the current recession. The legislature 8 further finds that this program may be funded by the anticipated 9 federal economic stimulus funds. 10 The purpose of this Act is to prioritize the expenditure of 11 any federal economic stimulus package of aid to establish an 12 emergency environmental workforce for short-term employment for 13 individuals who have recently become unemployed due to Hawaii's 14 recent economic downturn. Individuals willing to accept the 15 challenge of a workforce job will assist the efforts to: 16 (1) Eradicate invasive species; and 17 (2) Carry out other ongoing environmental programs. 18 SECTION 2. There is established the emergency 19 environmental workforce to be attached to The Research

Corporation of the University of Hawaii for administrative

purposes. The emergency environmental workforce shall:

1	(1)	Employ approximately four hundred to four hundred
2		fifty individuals who were terminated or laid off from
3		their jobs as a result of the local economic downturn.
4		The individuals shall be employed as short-term
5		contract employees; and
6	(2)	Deploy contract employees to all state or county
7		agencies certifying a need for environmental clearance
8		and eradication services to supplement current
9		services being provided for the eradication of
10		invasive species or other ongoing environmental
11		improvement programs.
12	SECT	ION 3. The Research Corporation of the University of
13	Hawaii sh	all:
14	(1)	Together with the Pacific Cooperative Studies Unit,
15		develop a planning, administration, implementation,
16		and evaluation strategy, including a program duration
17		plan and a budget for contract and administrative
18		expenses;
19	(2)	Consult with private employers with workforces, that
20		have been, or that may be, affected by layoffs from
21		the recent economic downturn to develop a recruitment
22	¥	and public information plan;

1	(3)	Develop a strategy for the interviewing and selection	
2		of program participants;	
3	(4)	Work with state and county agencies requesting	
4		services to administer physical examinations, as may	
5		be necessary, to qualifying applicants prior to final	
6		contract offers;	
7	(5)	Direct that the attorneys employed or retained by the	
8		University of Hawaii prepare the necessary employment	
9		contracts to meet the objectives of the program on an	
10		expedited basis;	
11	(6)	Submit review and assessment reports to the governor,	
12		the senate president of the senate, and the speaker of	
13		the house of representatives every sixty days for the	
14		duration of the program; and	
15	(7)	Undertake all other necessary activities for program	
16		development and implementation.	
17	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of federal funds	
18	received	by the State from the economic stimulus act of 2009 the	
19	sum of \$	or so much thereof as may be necessary for	
20	fiscal ye	ar 2009-2010 to fund the emergency environmental	
21	workforce created by this Act.		

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Research
- 2 Corporation of the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this
- 3 Act.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
