BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1		S	SECTION 1.	Act	211,	Session	Laws	of	Hawaii	2008,	section
2	2,	is	amended:								

3 1. By amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

4 "(c) The task force shall prioritize its objectives, which
5 shall include, but not be limited to the following, in order to
6 ensure that it is able to sufficiently address and render
7 conclusions:

8	(1)	Develop guidelines, protocols, and recommendations for
9		taro policy, non-genetic modification based taro
10		research, and the allocation of resources to ensure
11		that taro is saved and protected in Hawaii;

12 (2) Develop a program of incentives and projects that have
13 the support of a broad spectrum of taro growers that
14 will enhance taro security, protect taro purity,

15 provide support to taro farms and farmers, and improve 16 taro markets for the long-term;

17 (3) Support the recovery of traditional Hawaiian taro18 cultivars throughout the State;

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1	(4)	Increase public awareness of the value of taro and its
2		role culturally, socially, in health and well-being,
3		environmentally, and economically in the State;
4	(5)	Develop a program to provide taro education and
5		training opportunities;
6	(6)	Develop a program for commercial taro growers to
7		maximize business viability and success;
8	(7)	Develop a taro farming grant program to assist taro
9		farmers in need to preserve the cultural legacy of
10		taro farming for future generations;
11	(8)	Discuss the feasibility and impact of requiring the
12		department of land and natural resources to provide
13		reduced lease rent rates for taro farmers on state-
14		leased land; [and]
15	(9)	Develop taro research and outreach for the control and
16		eradication of apple snails[+]; and
17	(10)	Identify sources of federal, state, county, and
18		private funding that may be used to encourage
19		cultivation of non-genetically-engineered Hawaiian
20		taro varieties for projects related to flood control,
21		food security, non-genetically-engineered Hawaiian



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1	taro research, economic development, job creation,						
2	education, and water quality protection."						
3	2. By amending subsection (e) to read as follows:						
4	"(e) The task force shall submit a preliminary report to						
5	the legislature documenting the status of its progress no later						
6	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session						
7	of 2009. The task force shall submit a [final] second						
8	preliminary report to the legislature [summarizing its program,						
9	the results achieved, actual-expenditures, and recommended						
10	legislation] documenting the status of its progress no later						
11	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session						
12	of 2010.						
13	The task force shall submit a final report to the						
14	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of						
15	the regular session of 2012. The final report shall include:						
16	(1) Recommendations to the legislature on how it can						
17	promote economic activity and taro cultivation;						
18	(2) A summary of its programs;						
19	(3) The results achieved by the task force and its						
20	programs;						
21	(4) The actual expenditures by the task force; and						
22	(5) Any recommended legislation."
