A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION SITES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's economy is	
2	driven by	thousands of businesses that provide essential goods,	
3	services,	and jobs. However, an underground economy exists that	
4	threatens	the ability of legitimate businesses to effectively	
5	compete i	n the marketplace. Underground business operations	
6	typically:		
7	(1)	Avoid licensing requirements;	
8	(2)	Pay wages in cash, allowing the avoidance of payroll	
9	ч	taxes, unemployment insurance, disability insurance,	
10		personal income tax, and paid family leave;	
11	(3)	Employ vulnerable workers, new immigrants, and	
12		economically disadvantaged individuals;	
13	(4)	Fail to pay minimum wages required by state and	
14		federal law;	
15	(5)	Fail to carry workers' compensation insurance; and	
16	(6)	Avoid worker and workplace safety requirements.	
17	The	legislature further finds that underground business	
18	operation	s drive down wages, create harsh working conditions,	
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and undercut a legitimate business! profit margins. Underground 1 2 business operations are a threat to the state's economy, 3 workforce, and consumers. 4 The purpose of this Act is to create a construction site 5 inspection task force to investigate and inspect construction 6 sites for unlicensed contractors. 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 9 and to read as follows: 10 "§444- Construction site inspection task force. (a) 11 The director shall establish a construction site inspection task 12 force attached to the department of commerce and consumer 13 affairs for administrative purposes. The director, or the 14 director's designee, shall serve as chairperson of the construction site inspection task force. The task force shall 15 16 include at least two representatives from the department of 17 commerce and consumer affairs other than the director. The task 18 force shall also include a representative from each county 19 permitting department. 20 (b) The construction site inspection task force shall: 21 Facilitate and encourage the development and sharing (1) 22 of information by the participating agencies necessary



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1			to combat unlicensed contractor activity, including		
2			shared automated information database systems, the use		
3			of a common business identification number, and a		
4			centralized debt-collection system;		
5		(2)	Improve the coordination of activities among the		
6			participating agencies;		
7		(3)	Develop methods to pool, focus, and target the		
8			enforcement resources of the participating agencies to		
9			deter unlicensed contractor activity and maximize		
10			recoveries from violators of applicable laws and		
11			rules; and		
12		(4)	Reduce enforcement costs wherever possible by		
13			eliminating duplicative audits and investigations.		
14		(c)	In addition, the task force shall have the authority		
15	to:				
16		(1)	Form joint enforcement teams to use the existing		
17			collective investigative and enforcement capabilities		
18			of the participating members, including inspectors		
19			appointed by the director or by participating members.		
20			The joint enforcement teams shall conduct site		
21			inspections on sites suspected of engaging in		
22			unlicensed contractor activity. The teams shall also		
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1		<u>cond</u>	uct random site inspections to ensure compliance
2		with	existing laws;
3	(2)	Soli	cit the cooperation and participation of other
4		stat	e and local agencies in carrying out the
5		obje	ctives of the task force;
6	(3)	Esta	blish procedures for soliciting referrals from the
7		publ	ic, including an advertised telephone hotline;
8	(4)	Deve	lop procedures to permit the use of civil
9		sanc	tions in lieu of criminal actions wherever
10		poss	ible; and
11	<u>(5</u>)	Eval	uate the need for statutory changes to achieve the
12		purp	oses of this section, including:
13		(A)	Eliminating barriers to interagency information
14			sharing;
15		<u>(B)</u>	Improving the ability of the participating
16			agencies to audit, investigate, and prosecute
17			violations;
18		(C)	Deterring violations and improving voluntary
19			compliance;
20		<u>(D)</u>	Establishing centralized, automated debt
21			collection services for the participating
22			agencies; and





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1		(E) Emphasizing civil penalties instead of criminal		
2		ones whenever possible.		
3	(d)	For the purposes of this section, members of any joint		
4	enforceme	nt team formed by the task force pursuant to subsection		
5	(c)(1) may enter at reasonable times, without prior notice, any			
6	property, public or private, for the purpose of investigating			
7	and inspecting the condition or operation of any construction			
8	site ther	eon.		
9	(e)	The task force shall submit an annual report to the		
10	legislatu	re no later than twenty days before the convening of		
11	each regu	lar session. The report shall include all of the		
12	following	<u>:</u>		
13	(1)	The number of cases of violations and noncompliance		
14		under this chapter identified, audited, investigated,		
15		or prosecuted through civil action or referred for		
16		criminal prosecution;		
17	(2)	Actions taken by the task force to publicize its		
18	·.	activities; and		
19	(3)	Recommendations for any legislation needed to		
20		accomplish the goals described in subsection (c)(5).		
21	(f)	Beginning July 1, 2010, for every payment of fees into		
22	the compl	iance resolution fund pursuant to section 26-9(o) as a		
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1	condition of a license issued under this chapter, the licensee
2	shall pay to the director an additional fee of \$20 that shall be
3	deposited into a separate account in the compliance resolution
4	fund. Payments under this subsection shall be used to fund the
5	operations of the task force."
6	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
