A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION SITES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's economy is	
2	driven by	thousands of businesses that provide essential goods,	
3	services,	and jobs. However, an underground economy exists that	
4	threatens	the ability of legitimate businesses to effectively	
5	compete i	n the marketplace. Underground business operations	
6	typically:		
7	(1)	Avoid licensing requirements;	
8	(2)	Pay wages in cash, allowing the avoidance of payroll	
9		taxes, unemployment insurance, disability insurance,	
10		personal income tax, and paid family leave;	
11	(3)	Employ vulnerable workers, new immigrants, and	
12		economically disadvantaged individuals;	
13	(4)	Fail to pay minimum wages required by state and	
14		federal law;	
15	(5)	Fail to carry workers' compensation insurance; and	
16	(6)	Avoid worker and workplace safety requirements.

         SECTION 2. Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

    and to read as follows:

         "§444- Construction site inspection task force.

    The director shall establish a construction site inspection task

    force attached to the department of commerce and consumer
15
    affairs for administrative purposes. The director, or the

    director's designee, shall serve as chairperson of the

    construction site inspection task force. The task force shall

    include at least two representatives from the department of

    commerce and consumer affairs other than the director. The task

    force shall also include a representative from each county
21
    permitting department.

         (b) The construction site inspection task force shall:

2			of information by the participating agencies necessary
3			to combat unlicensed contractor activity, including
4			shared automated information database systems, the use
5			of a common business identification number, and a

7		(2) Improve the coordination of activities among the	
8			<pre>participating agencies;</pre>
9		<u>(3)</u>	Develop methods to pool, focus, and target the
10			enforcement resources of the participating agencies to
11			deter unlicensed contractor activity and maximize
12			recoveries from violators of applicable laws and
13			rules; and
14		(4)	Reduce enforcement costs wherever possible by
15			eliminating duplicative audits and investigations.

6		state and local agencies in carrying out the	
7		objectives of the task force;	
8	(3)	Establish procedures for soliciting referrals from the	
9		<pre>public, including an advertised telephone hotline;</pre>	
10	(4)	Develop procedures to permit the use of civil	
11		sanctions in lieu of criminal actions wherever	
12		possible; and	
13	(5)	Evaluate the need for statutory changes to achieve the	
14		purposes of this section, including:	
15		(A) Eliminating barriers to interagency information	
16		sharing;	
17		(B) Improving the ability of the participating	
18		agencies to audit, investigate, and prosecute	
19		<u>violations;</u>	
20		(C) Deterring violations and improving voluntary	
21		compliance;	

1		(D)	Establishing centralized, automated debt		
2			collection services for the participating		
3			agencies; and		
4		(E)	Emphasizing civil penalties instead of criminal		
5			ones whenever possible.		
6	(d)	For	the purposes of this section, members of any joint		
7	enforcement team formed by the task force pursuant to subsection				
8	(c)(1) may enter at reasonable times, without prior notice, any				
9	property, public or private, for the purpose of investigating				
10	and inspecting the condition or operation of any construction				
11	site thereon.				
12	(e)	The	task force shall submit an annual report to the		
13	legislatu	re no	later than twenty days before the convening of		
14	each regular session. The report shall include all of the				
15	following	<u>:</u>			
16	(1)	The 1	number of cases of violations and noncompliance		
17		unde	r this chapter identified, audited, investigated,		
18		or p	rosecuted through civil action or referred for		
19		crim	inal prosecution;		
20	(2)	Acti	ons taken by the task force to publicize its

1 (3) Recommendations for any legislation needed to 2 accomplish the goals described in subsection (c)(5). 3 (f) Beginning July 1, 2010, for every payment of fees into 4 the compliance resolution fund pursuant to section 26-9(o) as a 5 condition of a license issued under this chapter, the licensee 6 shall pay to the director an additional fee of \$20 that shall be 7 deposited into a separate account in the compliance resolution 8 fund. Payments under this subsection shall be used to fund the 9 operations of the task force." **10** SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
