A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In response to the recent increase in emissions 2 from Kilauea's newest vent at Halema'uma'u crater, a House 3 Special Committee on Vog Effects (Committee) was created to 4 bring together experts to examine the effects of vog on the 5 people of the State of Hawaii. The Committee held a series of 6 fact-finding meetings focusing on health and public safety, 7 agriculture, and economic impacts and tourism. The need to 8 ensure that an effective system was in place to monitor and warn 9 the public of dangerous levels of the sulfur dioxide in vog 10 became apparent through these meetings.

11 The purpose of this Act is to direct the department of 12 defense to develop and implement a program to ensure that an 13 adequate number of monitors to detect sulfur dioxide are 14 strategically placed throughout areas of the state where high 15 incidences of vog, sulfur dioxide, or both occur.

16 SECTION 2. The department of defense, in consultation with 17 the department of health and the interagency task force on vog, 18 shall develop and implement a program to ensure that an adequate HB HMS 2009-1178

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number of monitors to detect sulfur dioxide are strategically
placed throughout areas of the state where high incidences of
vog, sulfur dioxide, or both occur. For the purposes of this
Act:

5 "High incidences" means situations where the presence of 6 vog, sulfur dioxide, or both, reaches levels that present a 7 danger to health and safety, as determined by the department of 8 defense, in consultation with the department of health and the 9 interagency task force on vog.

10 "Vog" means the substance created when sulfur dioxide and 11 other volcanic gases combine and interact chemically in the 12 atmosphere with oxygen, moisture, dust, and sunlight over 13 periods of minutes to days to form a visible haze consisting of 14 gas plus a suspended mixture of tiny liquid and solid particles. 15 SECTION 3. The department of defense shall submit a report 16 on its progress in establishing the sulfur dioxide monitoring 17 program required by this Act, including any proposed 18 legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 19 the regular session of 2010.

20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.21
