### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOLCANIC EMISSIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. In response to the recent increase in emissions
from Kilauea's newest vent at Halema'uma'u crater, a House
Special Committee on Vog Effects (Committee) was created to
bring together experts to examine the effects of vog on the
people of the State of Hawaii. The Committee held a series of
fact-finding meetings focusing on health and public safety,
agriculture, and economic impacts and tourism.

8 One matter considered by the Committee was the safety of 9 workers who, due to their work-related duties or environments, 10 may be exposed to dangerous levels of vog or sulfur dioxide. 11 The establishment of work safety standards specifically tailored 12 for vog events would greatly benefit the health and safety of 13 these workers.

14 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 15 labor and industrial relations, in consultation with the 16 department of health and the interagency task force on vog, to 17 establish standards to promote worker safety during high

18 incidences of vog or sulfur dioxide.

# H.B. NO. 315

SECTION 2. The department of labor and industrial
relations, in consultation with the department of health and the
interagency task force on vog, shall adopt occupational safety
and health standards pursuant to chapter 396, Hawaii Revised
Statutes, to promote the safety of workers during high
incidences of vog, sulfur dioxide, or both. For the purposes of
this Act:

8 "High incidences" means situations where the presence of 9 vog, sulfur dioxide, or both, reaches levels that present a 10 danger to worker safety, as determined by the department of 11 labor and industrial relations.

12 "Vog" means the substance created when sulfur dioxide and 13 other volcanic gases combine and interact chemically in the 14 atmosphere with oxygen, moisture, dust, and sunlight over 15 periods of minutes to days developing into a visible haze 16 consisting of gas plus a suspended mixture of tiny liquid and 17 solid particles.

18 "Worker" means any person holding a job position with 19 attendant work duties, assignments, locations, or work sites 20 that place that person in potential contact with high incidences 21 of vog, sulfur dioxide, or both.

SECTION 3. The department of labor and industrial
relations shall submit a report of its progress in establishing
the occupational safety and health standards required by this
Act, including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty
days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2010.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Report Title:

Vog; Sulfur Dioxide; Occupational Safety and Health Standards

### Description:

Requires the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, in consultation with the Department of Health and the Interagency Task Force on Vog, to establish standards to promote worker safety during high incidences of vog or sulfur dioxide.
