A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL DEFENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

2 The legislature finds that Hawaii is vulnerable SECTION 1. 3 to a tsunami or hurricane disaster and recognizes the importance 4 of remaining vigilant in protecting its residents and quests 5 from these disasters. In view of lessons learned from the 2004 tsunami in southeast Asia and hurricane Katrina in Florida in 6 7 2005, and because these natural disasters could cause tremendous 8 devastation in Hawaii, the legislature deems it vitally 9 important to ensure that the State is adequately prepared to 10 deal with these disasters. While state and private agencies have made great strides in becoming capable of responding to a 11 12 tsunami or hurricane disaster, more resources are needed to 13 upgrade and decrease coverage gaps in the existing warning 14 systems.

15 The purpose of this part is to provide for tsunami warning 16 sirens in new residential developments by allowing the counties 17 to condition the approval of permits for the construction of new 18 residential housing in tsunami inundation zones on the HB LRB 09-1040.doc

installation of tsunami warning sirens or payment of impact
 fees.
 SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
 read as follows:

 "§46- Installation of tsunami warning sirens. (a)

7 Prior to issuing permits for the development of any new 8 residential housing consisting of fifty or more residential 9 units within a tsunami inundation zone, the counties may require 10 the developer requesting the permits to install tsunami warning 11 sirens within the development, to be linked to the civil defense 12 warning system. The department of defense may determine the 13 specifications for the tsunami warning sirens and their 14 placement. 15 (b) Prior to issuing permits for the development of any 16 new residential housing consisting of less than fifty 17 residential units within a tsunami inundation zone, the counties 18 may impose impact fees pursuant to this chapter for the purpose 19 of installing tsunami warning sirens within the development. 20 (c) For purposes of this section, "residential units" 21 includes single-family, duplex, and multi-family dwelling

2	SECTION 3. The legislature finds that it is crucial to
3	provide notice of an impending natural disaster or emergency to
4	segments of the population that are hearing impaired or cannot
5	understand verbal or written communications in the languages
6	commonly used in the State. The purpose of this part is to
7	require the disability communications access board to identify
8	internationally recognized symbols that may be transmitted
9	through various forms of visual digital communications, such as
10	cellular telephones, computers, and television, in the event of
11	a disaster or emergency.
12	SECTION 4. The disability communications access board
13	shall identify internationally recognized symbols to be used in
14	the event of a disaster or emergency to communicate notice
15	through visual digital communications to persons who do not
16	understand verbal or written communications.
17	The disability communications access board shall report its
18	findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than
19	December 1, 2009.

Description:
