A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 240, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is 2 amended by amending section 13 to read as follows: 3 "SECTION 13. [Solar water heating pay] Pay as you save program; purpose; establishment; tariff filing. (a) Solar 4 5 water heating systems and photovoltaic energy systems are a renewable energy technology that uses solar collectors placed on 6 7 roofs to heat water [-] or provide electricity. These systems decrease reliance on imported oil used to generate electricity 8 9 to heat water or provide electricity because they use less 10 energy than the electric [hot water heating] systems replaced. 11 In addition, the replacement of older, less efficient household 12 appliances with energy efficient appliances will also decrease 13 energy usage. 14 The legislature finds that the up-front cost of 15 installation is a barrier preventing many Hawaii residents from 16 installing solar water heating systems [-] or photovoltaic energy 17 systems. 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1	significant barrier to installing more efficient appliances.
2	The legislature further finds that the renewable energy
3	technologies income tax credit and electric utility rebates have
4	not been enough of an incentive to overcome these up-front
5	costs, especially for rental housing and homes in need of
6	retrofit for these important energy-saving devices.
7	The purpose of this section is to authorize the public
8	utilities commission to implement a pilot project to be called
9	the ["solar water heating pay] <u>"pay</u> as you save program".
10	(b) The public utilities commission shall implement a
11	pilot project to be called the ["solar water heating pay] <u>"pay</u>
12	as you save program", which shall:
13	(1) Allow [a] residential and small commercial electric
14	utility [customer] <u>customers</u> to purchase a solar water
15	heating system[+] or a photovoltaic energy system:
16	(A) With no upfront payments; and
17	(B) By paying the cost of the system over time on the
18	customer's electricity bill[+] at an interest
19	rate to be determined by the public utilities
20	commission;
21	provided that the estimated life cycle electricity
22	savings from the solar water heating system $\underline{\text{or}}$
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1		photovoltaic energy system exceeds the cost of the
2		system;
3	(2)	Provide for billing and payment of the solar water
4		heating system or photovoltaic energy system on the
5		utility bill;
6	(3)	Provide for disconnection of utility service for
7		non-payment of [solar water heating system] pay as you
8		save payments; [and]
9	(4)	Allow for assignment of system repayment costs
10		attached to the meter location $[-]_{\underline{\cdot}}$
11	(5)	Allow customers to exchange a qualifying refrigerator,
12		manufactured prior to a date determined by the public
13		utilities commission, for a new ENERGY STAR
14		refrigerator; subject to qualifications established by
15		the public utilities commission; provided that
16		customers shall make no up front payment but shall be
17		allowed to pay any costs associated with the exchange
18		over time on the customer's electricity bill; and
19	(6)	Allow customers who enroll in the program to receive
20	x	an energy audit with the cost partially paid by the
21		public benefits fee administrator, contracted pursuant



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1	to section 269-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, at a rate
2	to be determined by the public utilities commission.
3	(c) The public utilities commission shall determine the
4	time frame of the pilot program and shall gather and analyze
5	information to evaluate the pilot $program[-]$ and shall report
6	this information to the energy resources coordinator.
7	(d) The public benefits fee administrator shall administer
8	the pilot program and shall provide progress reports to the
9	public utilities commission eight months and fourteen months
10	after the start of the program and annually thereafter.
11	(e) The public benefits fee administrator may contract
12	with appropriately licensed or qualified persons to install
13	solar water heating systems or photovoltaic energy systems in
14	the pilot program and shall provide for the decommissioning and
15	disposal of refrigerators that are recovered from customers
16	pursuant to subsection (b)(5) in a manner that complies with all
17	applicable requirements for waste disposal.
18	(f) The public utilities commission may conduct follow up
19	evaluations of the program, including energy audits, efficiency
20	measurements, and verification.
21	[(d)] <u>(g)</u> No later than June 30, [2007,], each
22	electric utility shall implement by tariff a pay as you save



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1 model system program for [residential] consumers that is 2 consistent with this section. Each utility shall provide at 3 least six months prior notice of its proposed tariff to the 4 public utilities commission as prescribed in section 269-12(b), 5 Hawaii Revised Statutes. Within the prescribed notice period, 6 the public utilities commission shall review the proposed tariff 7 and after a hearing may require modifications to the proposed 8 tariff as necessary to comply with or effectuate the purposes of 9 this section.

10 $\left[\frac{}{(e)}\right]$ (h) The commission shall ensure that all reasonable 11 costs incurred by electric utilities to start up and implement 12 the pay as you save model system are recovered as part of the 13 utility's revenue requirement, including necessary billing 14 system adjustments and any costs for pay as you save model 15 system efficiency measures that are not recovered via 16 participating [residential] consumers' pay as you save model 17 system bill payments or otherwise.

18 (i) No later than December 31, 2009, the public utilities 19 commission shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, for the 20 purposes of the pay as you save program."

21 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
