A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow home school
2	students who would otherwise be denied the opportunity to do so,
3	to participate on an equal basis in extracurricular activities.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
6	and to read as follows:
7	"§302A- Home school students; extracurricular
8	activities. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary,
9	each public school, subject to the requirements of this section,
10	shall allow any home school student to participate on an equal
11	basis in any extracurricular activity offered by a public
12	school.
13	(b) Each private school may allow a student to participate
14	in an extracurricular activity offered by the private school, at
15	the private school's discretion.
16	(c) A public school shall not adopt or agree to be bound
17	by any rule or policy of any organization or association that
18	would prohibit any participation allowed by this section.
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1	(d) Any home school student may participate in an
2	extracurricular activity through any amateur association or
3	league of which the public school is not a member, and this
4	participation shall not prevent the student from participating
5	or affect the student's eligibility to participate in the same
6	extracurricular activity at any public school. Prior to
7	participating in any extracurricular activity through such an
8	amateur association or league, the home school student shall
9	obtain the express written permission of the principal of the
10	public school at which the student participates in the
11	extracurricular activity, which permission shall be granted if:
12	(1) The home school student's class attendance is not
13	compromised; and
14	(2) The home school student is in good academic
15	standing under the home school's activities
16	policy.
17	(e) Notwithstanding any rule adopted or agreed to by any
18	public school, any home school student who is sanctioned or is
19	found by the public school, or any organization or association
20	to which the school belongs, to be ineligible to participate in
21	any extracurricular activity for any reason, except
22	unsportsmanlike conduct or ejection from an activity, may appeal
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1	the sanction or finding. The appeal may be made through the
2	applicable process at the school, any league to which the school
3	belongs, or any other organization to which the school belongs.
4	(f) To participate in an extracurricular activity at a
5	public school, a home school student shall meet all of the
6	requirements imposed by the public school, including compliance
7	with:
8	(1) All laws governing the activity;
9	(2) All eligibility requirements imposed by the
10	public school;
11	(3) The same responsibilities and standards of
12	behavior as are imposed on other students
13	participating in the activity at the public
14	school; and
15	(4) The payment of all required activity-related
16	fees, including any fee provided in subsection
17	<u>(g)</u> .
18	(g) A public school may charge a home school student
19	participating in an extracurricular activity a participation fee
20	as a prerequisite to participation. The fee amount that the
21	school charges a home school student shall not exceed one
22	hundred fifty per cent of the fee amount the school would charge
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1	an enrolled student to participate in the extracurricular				
2	activity; provided that if any fee is collected pursuant to this				
3	subsection for participation in an extracurricular activity, the				
4	fee shall be used to fund the particular extracurricular				
5	activity for which it is charged and shall not be expended for				
6	any other purpose.				
7	(h) Home school students who participate in an				
8	extracurricular activity in a public school shall be included in				
9	the pupil enrollment of the public school where the student				
10	participates.				
11	(i) As used in this section:				
12	"Extracurricular activity" means a school-authorized or				
13	education-related activity occurring during or outside the				
14	regular instructional school say, including, but not limited to,				
15	sports, cheerleading, music, band, clubs, driver's education,				
16	after-school programs, and other programs.				
17	"Home school" means the sequential program of instruction				
18	for the education of a child which:				
19	(1) Takes place in a home;				
20	(2) Is provided by the child's parent or guardian or by an				
21	adult relative of the child designated by the parent				
22	or guardian;


1	(3)	Is not under the supervision and control of a public
2		school;
3	(4)	Is not intended to be and does not qualify as a
4		private and nonprofit school or a new century charter
5		school; and
6	(5)	Is subject to any rule adopted by the department of
7		education under title 8, chapter 12, Hawaii
8		Administrative Rules ("compulsory attendance
9		exceptions"), relating to home schooling.
10	<u>(j)</u>	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
11	91 to adm	inister and implement this section."

13	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
